The APP Arizona General Election Survey was conducted by IVR Interviews and Online Mobile from July 11 - July 16 among a random sample of 700 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

Are you 18 years of age and registered to vote in the state of Arizona?



How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in Arizona? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?

















Do you agree of disagree with the following statement? "I am proud to be an American."









Should children who say they identify as transgender be allowed to undergo physical sex change surgeries or chemical treatments while they are under the age of 18?



Should online pornography distributors be required by law to verify the age of users who access their content in order to help prevent children under the age of 18 from viewing obscene material?











What is your total household income?






