The APP Georgia General Election Survey was conducted by IVR Interviews and Online Mobile from July 11 - July 16 among a random sample of 700 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.7 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

How likely are you to vote in the November 3rd General Election in Michigan? Would you say you are extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?

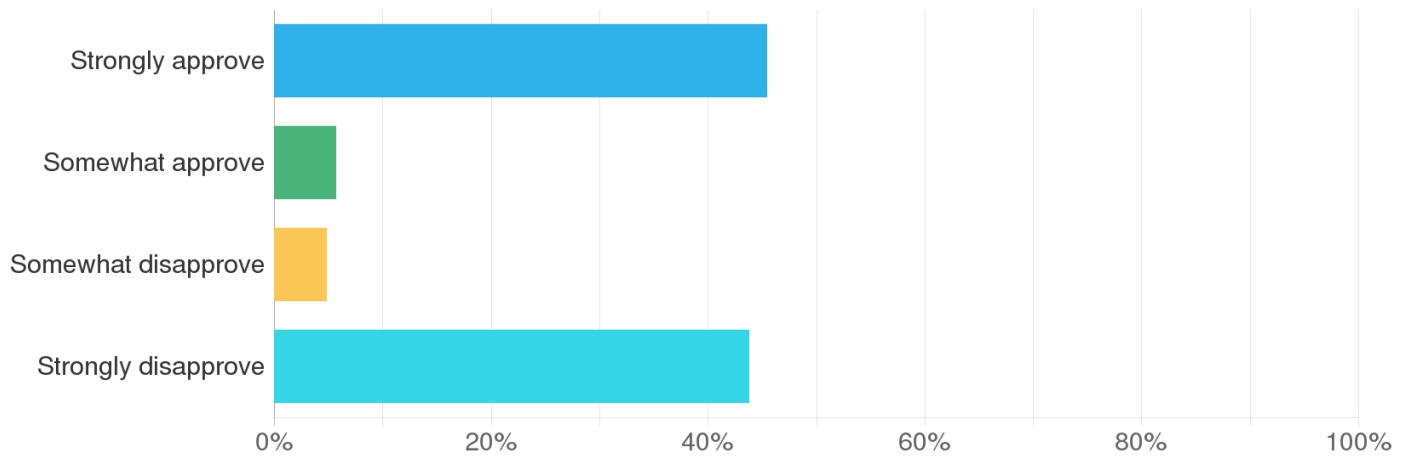

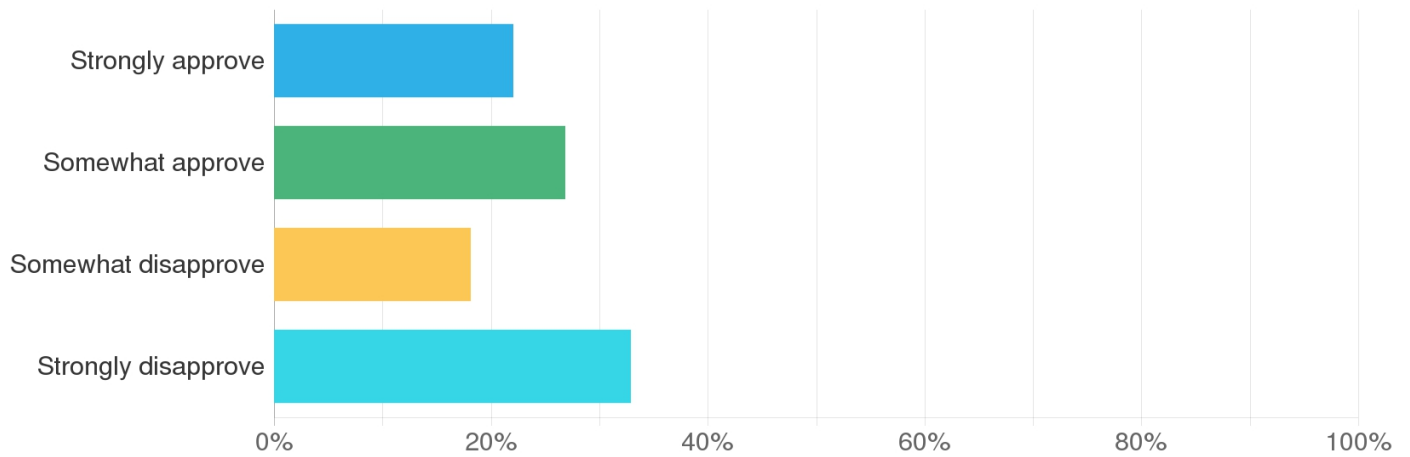

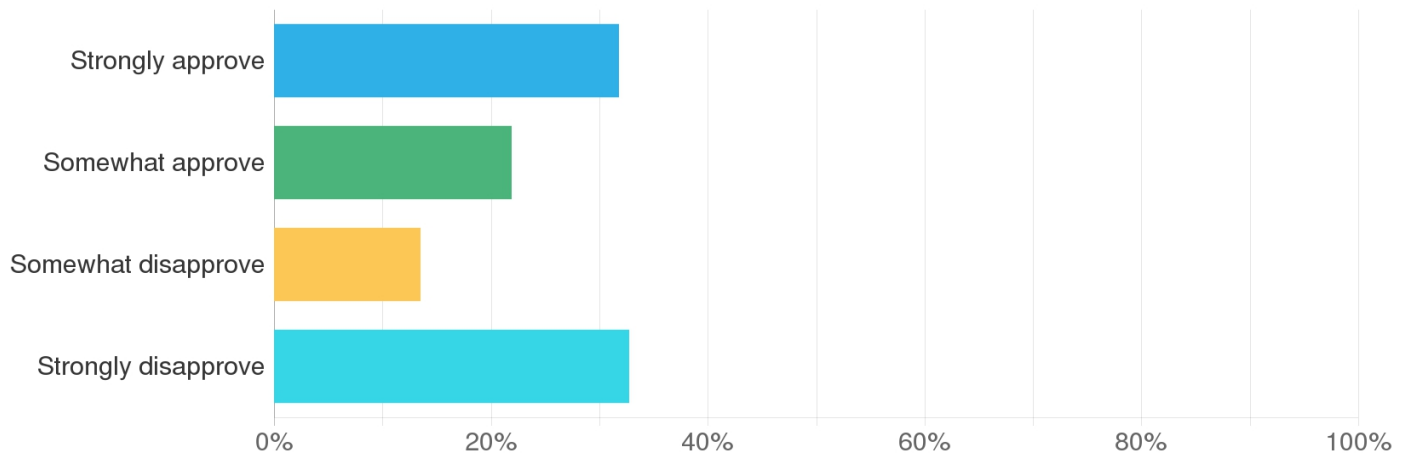

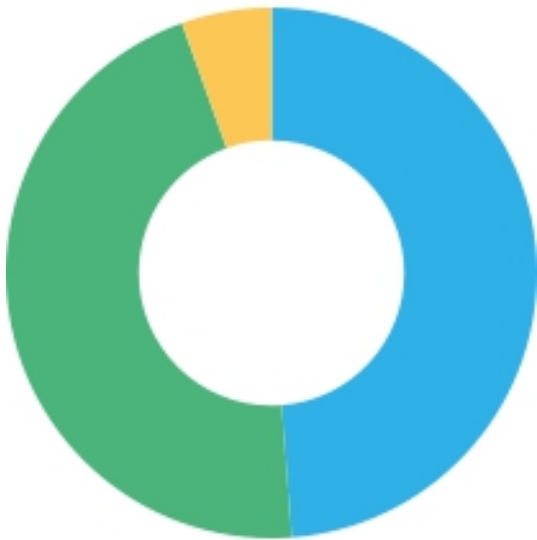

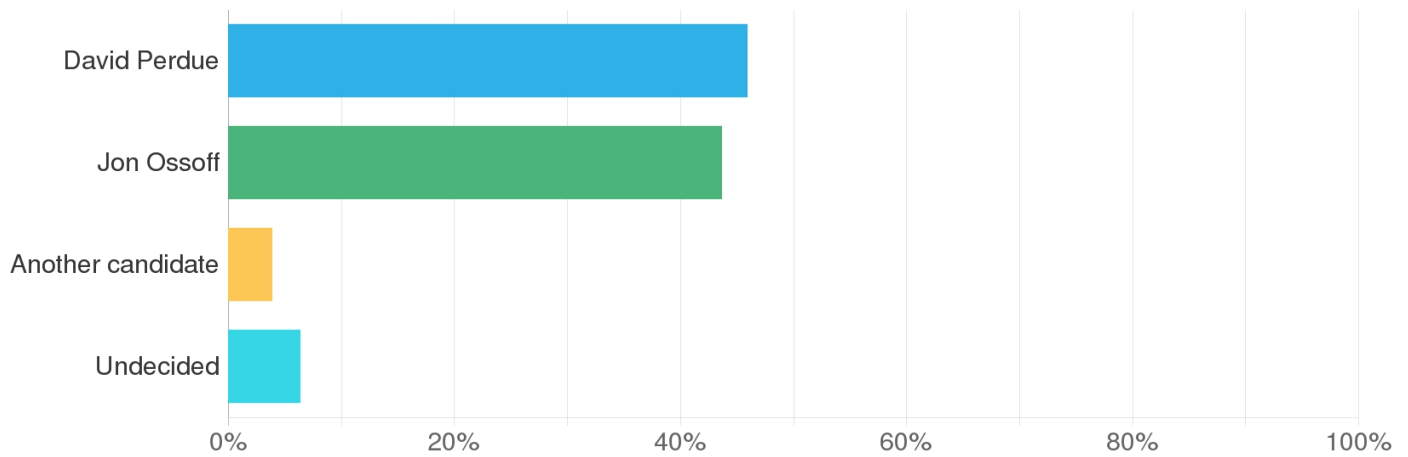

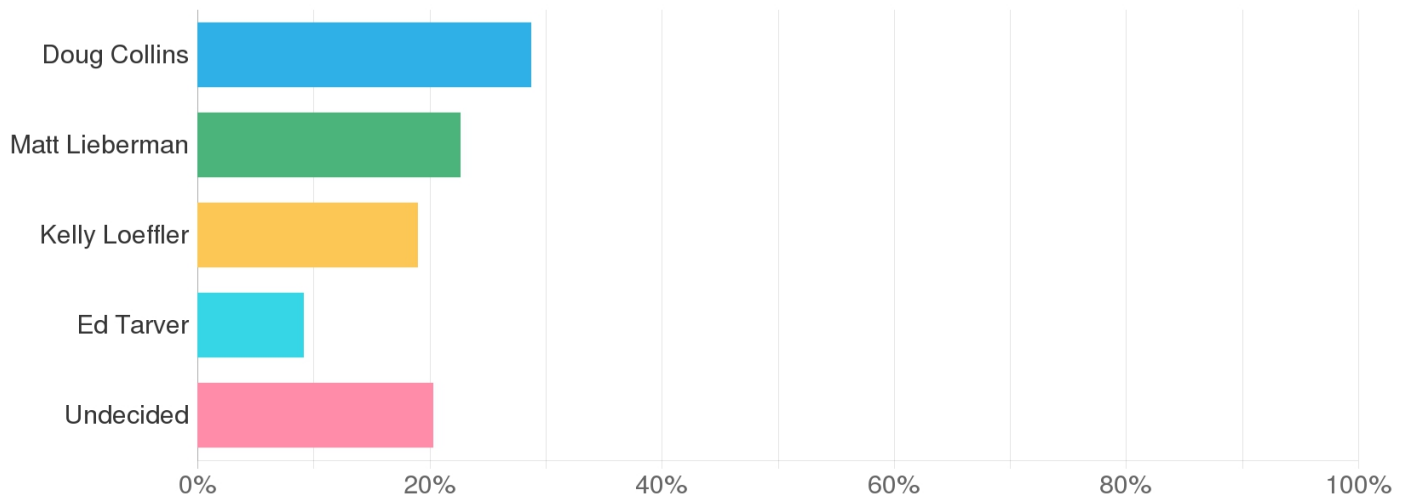

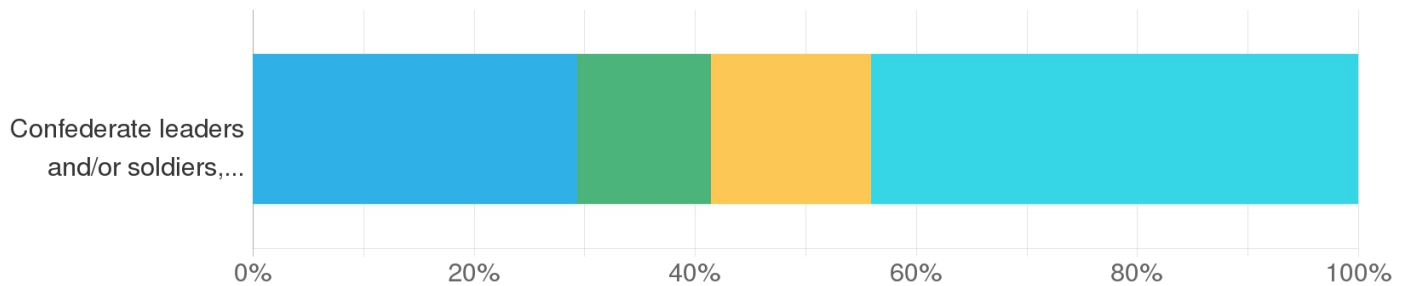

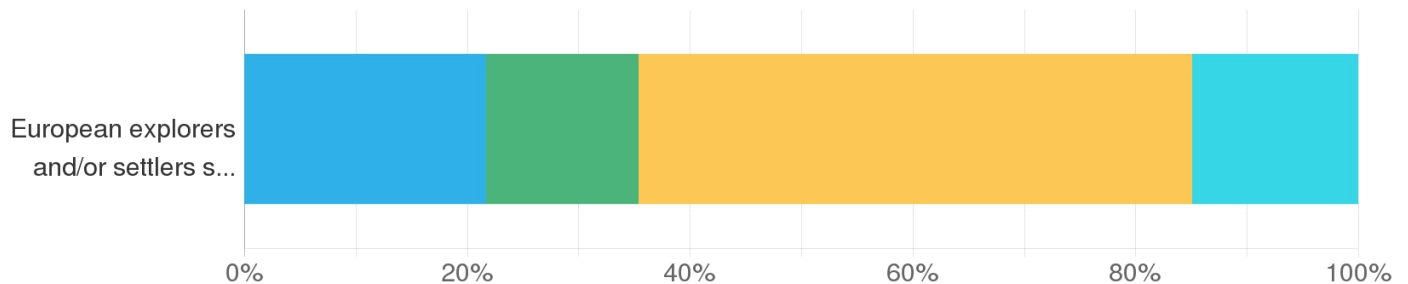

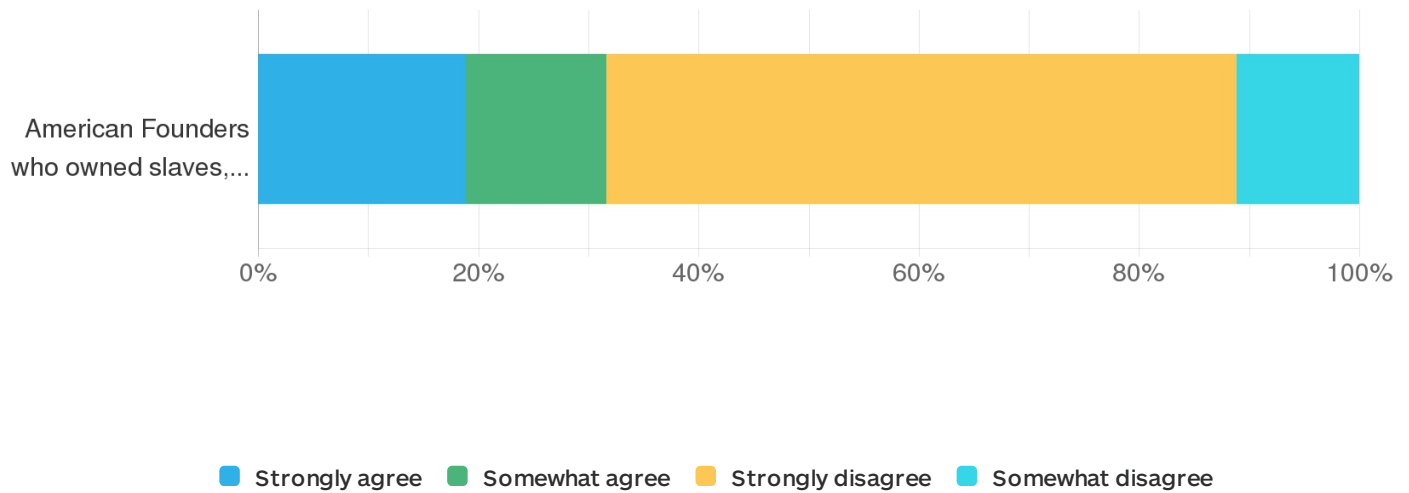

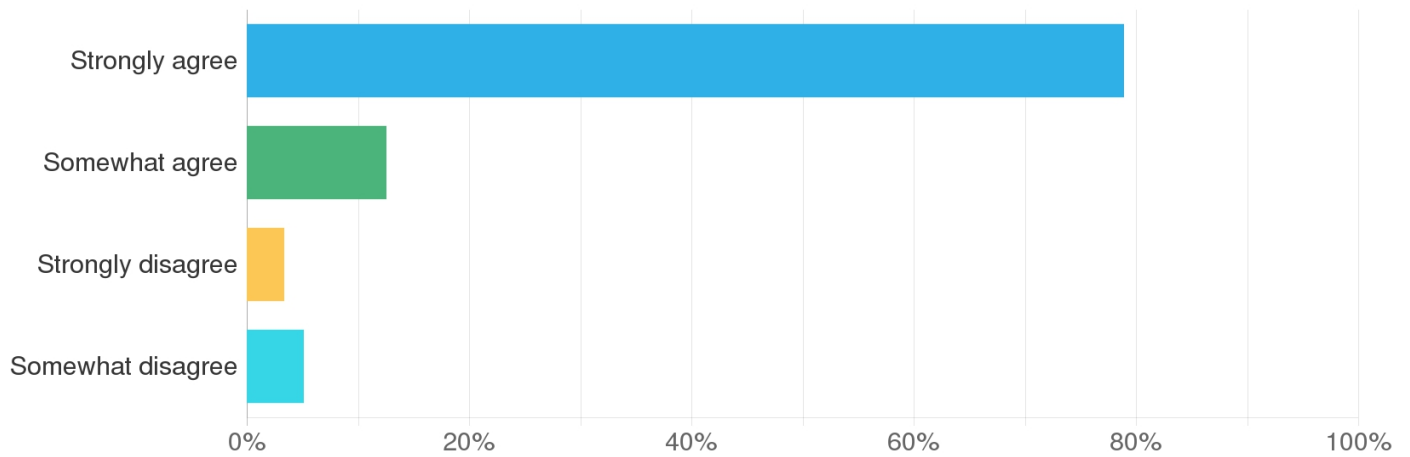

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? "I am proud to be an American."

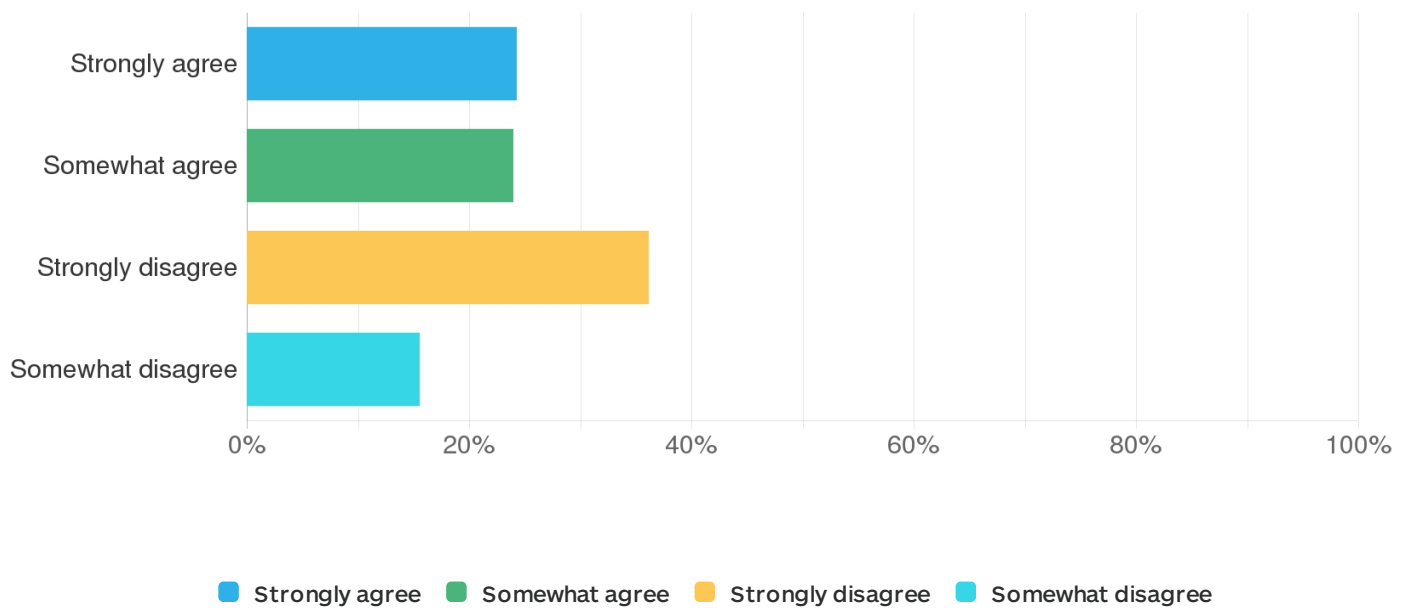

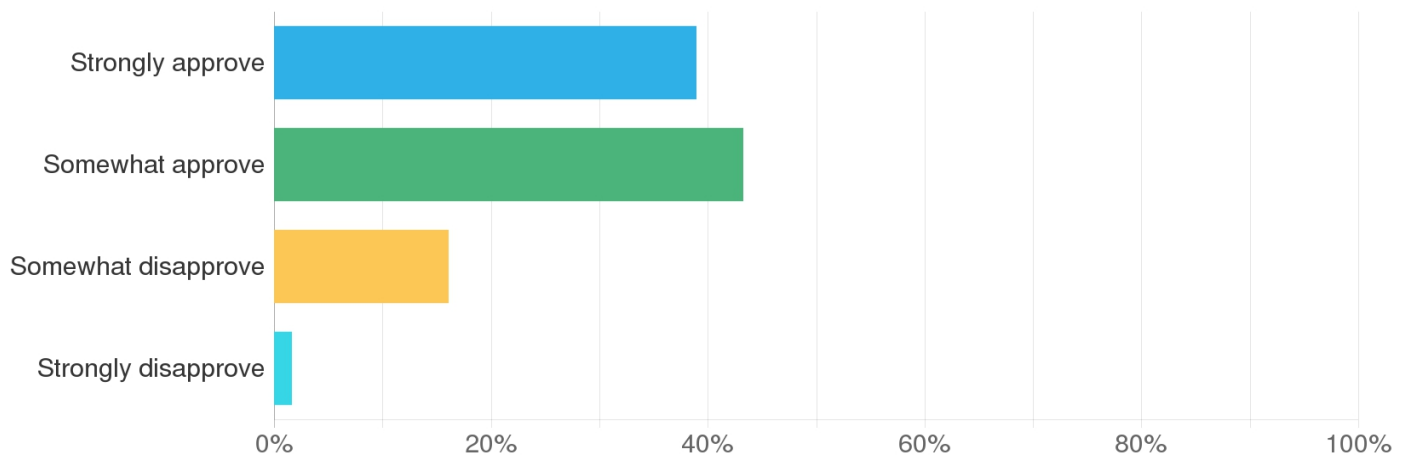

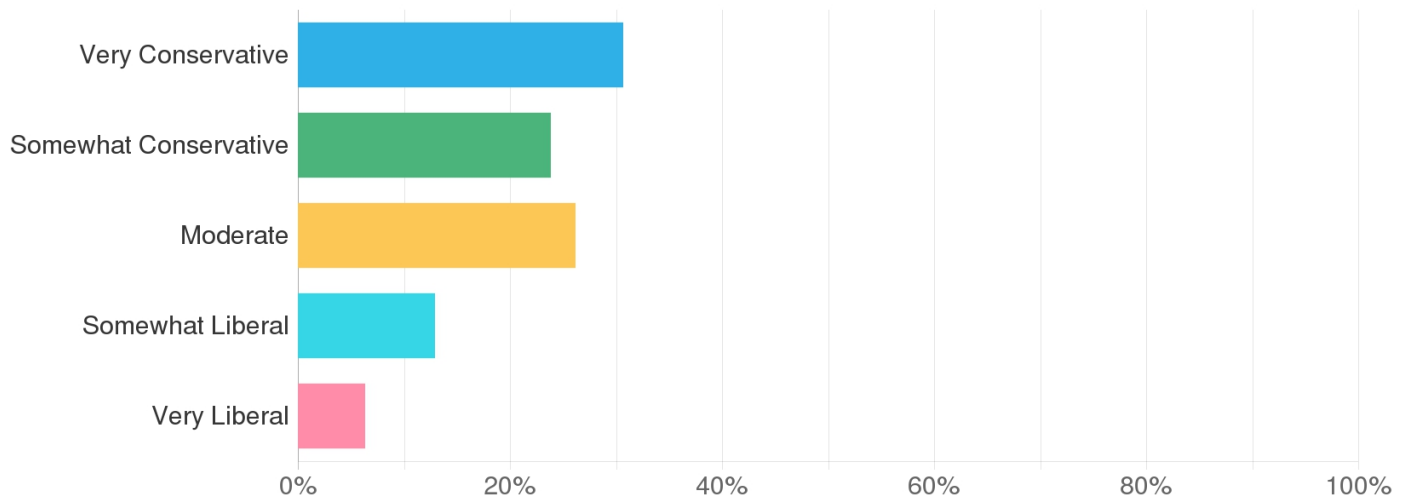

Do you consider yourself to be Very conservative, Somewhat Conservative, Moderate, Somewhat Liberal or Very Liberal?

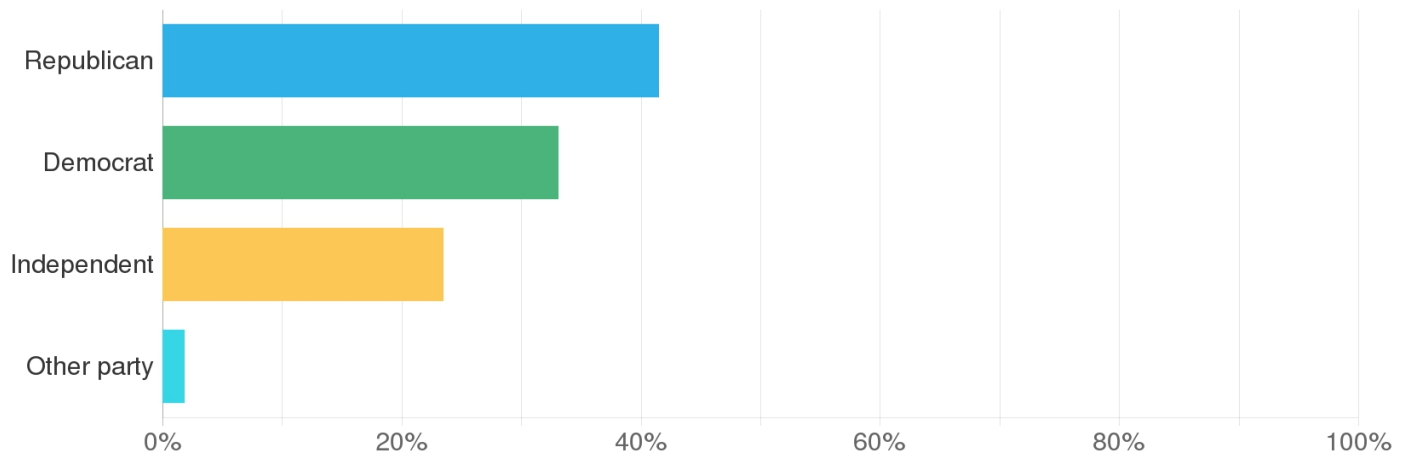

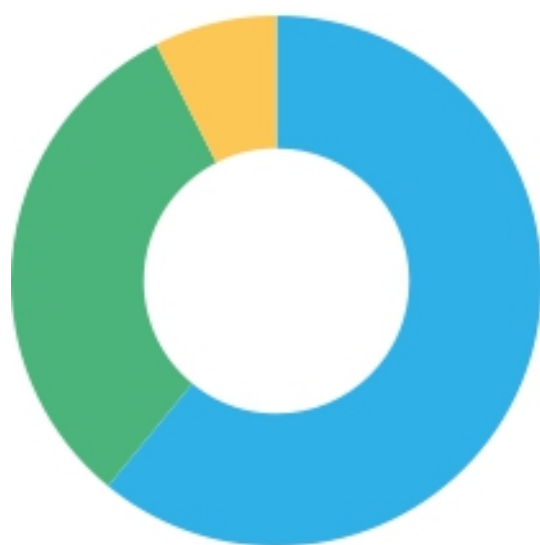

What is your ethnicity? Are you....

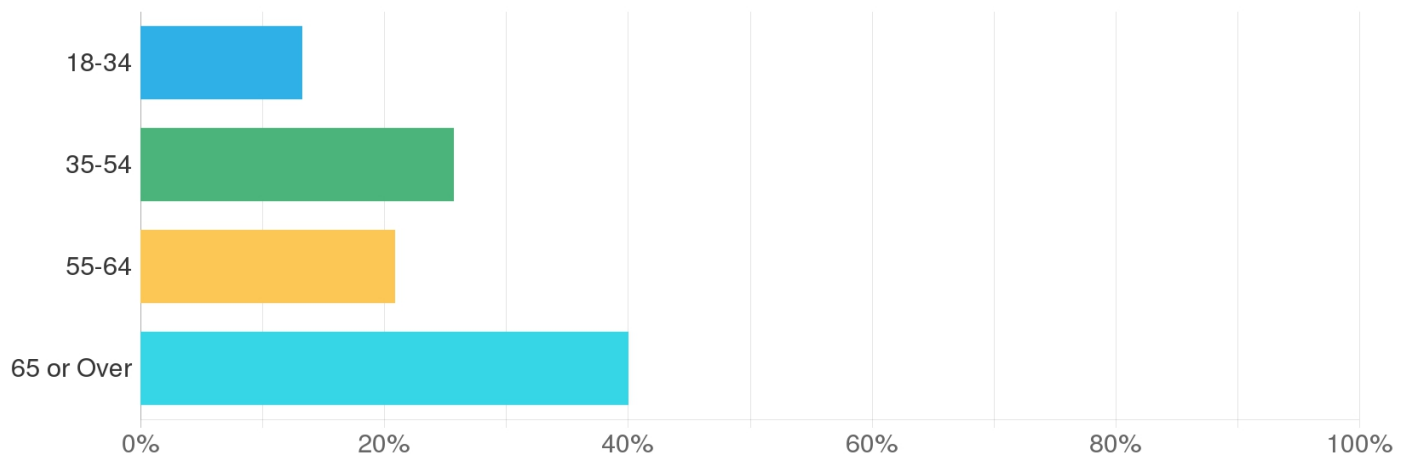

What is your age? Are you...

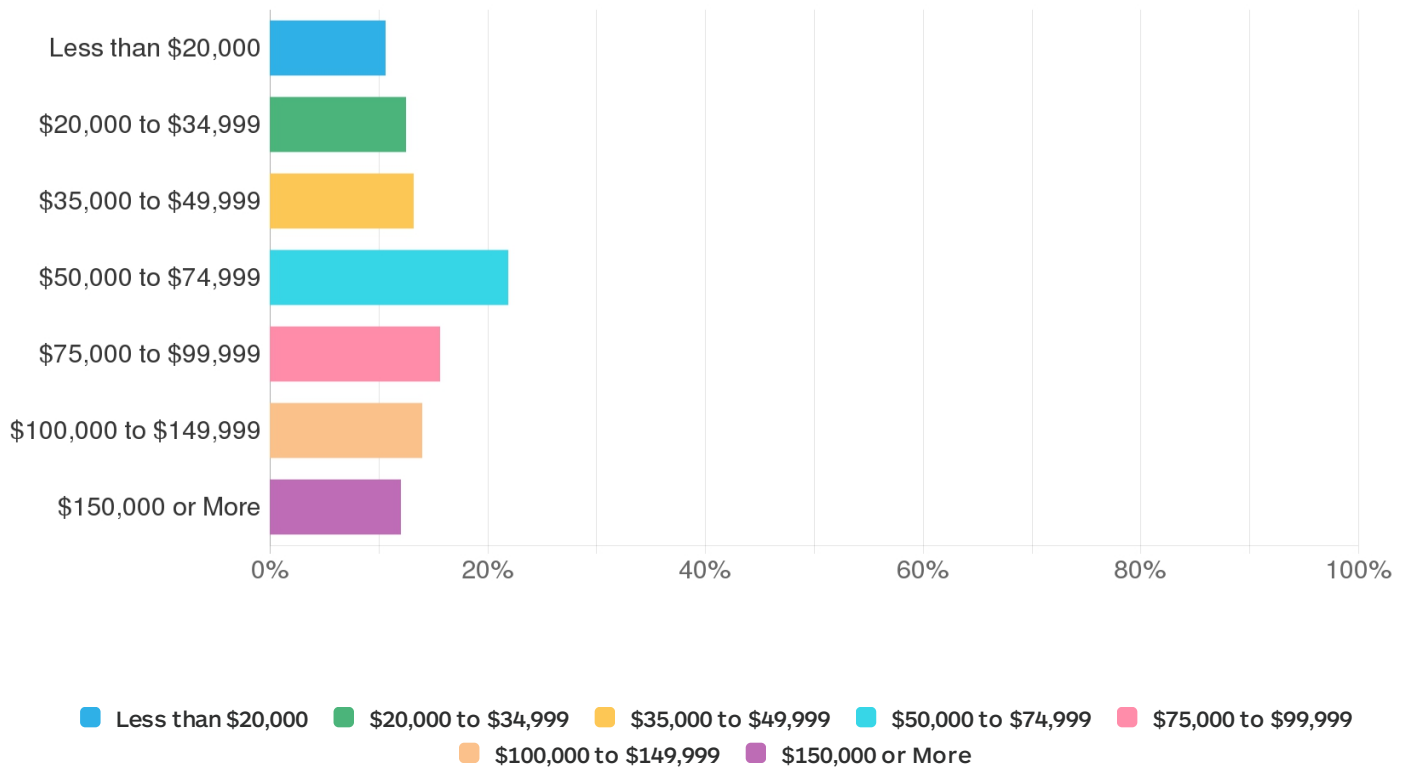

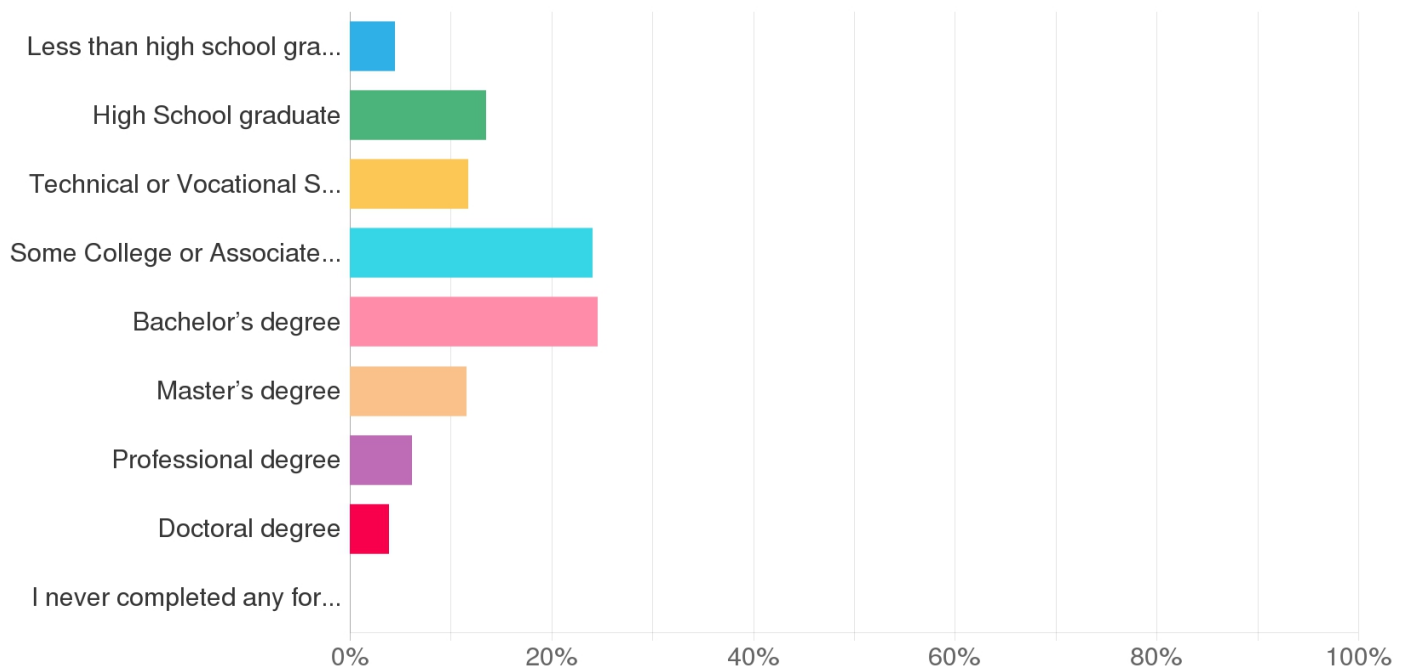

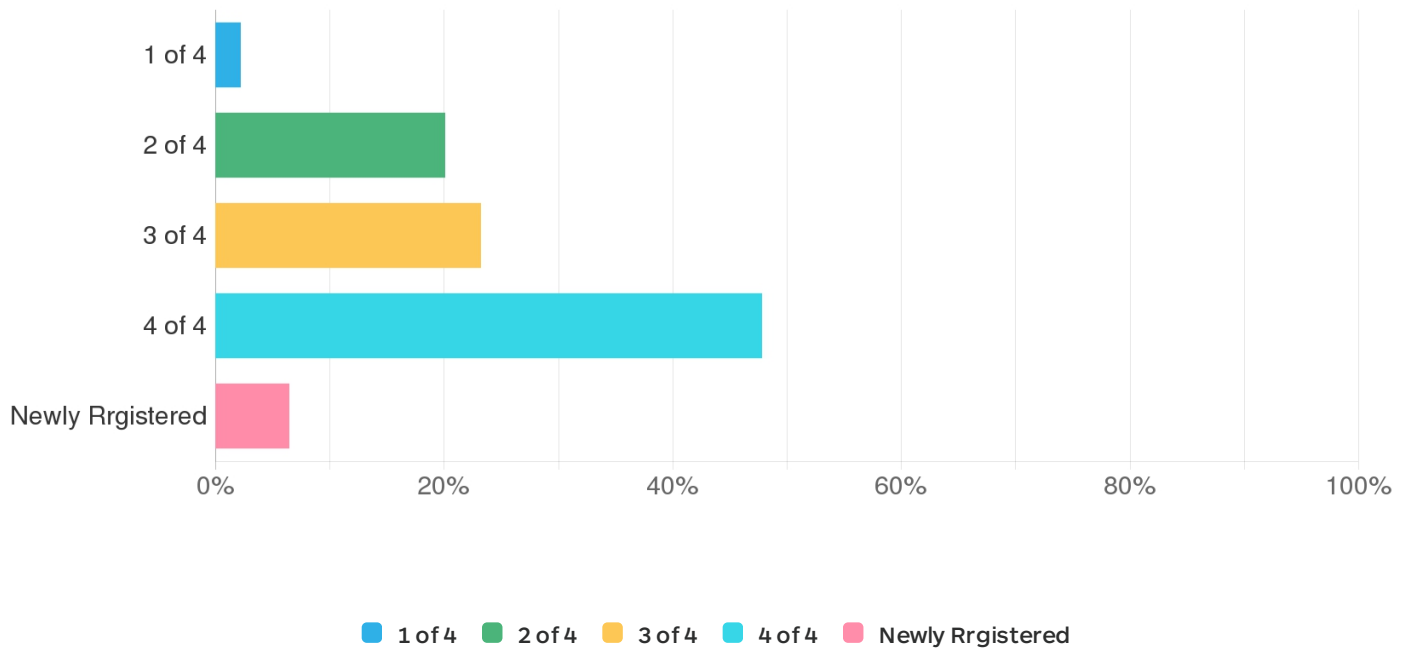

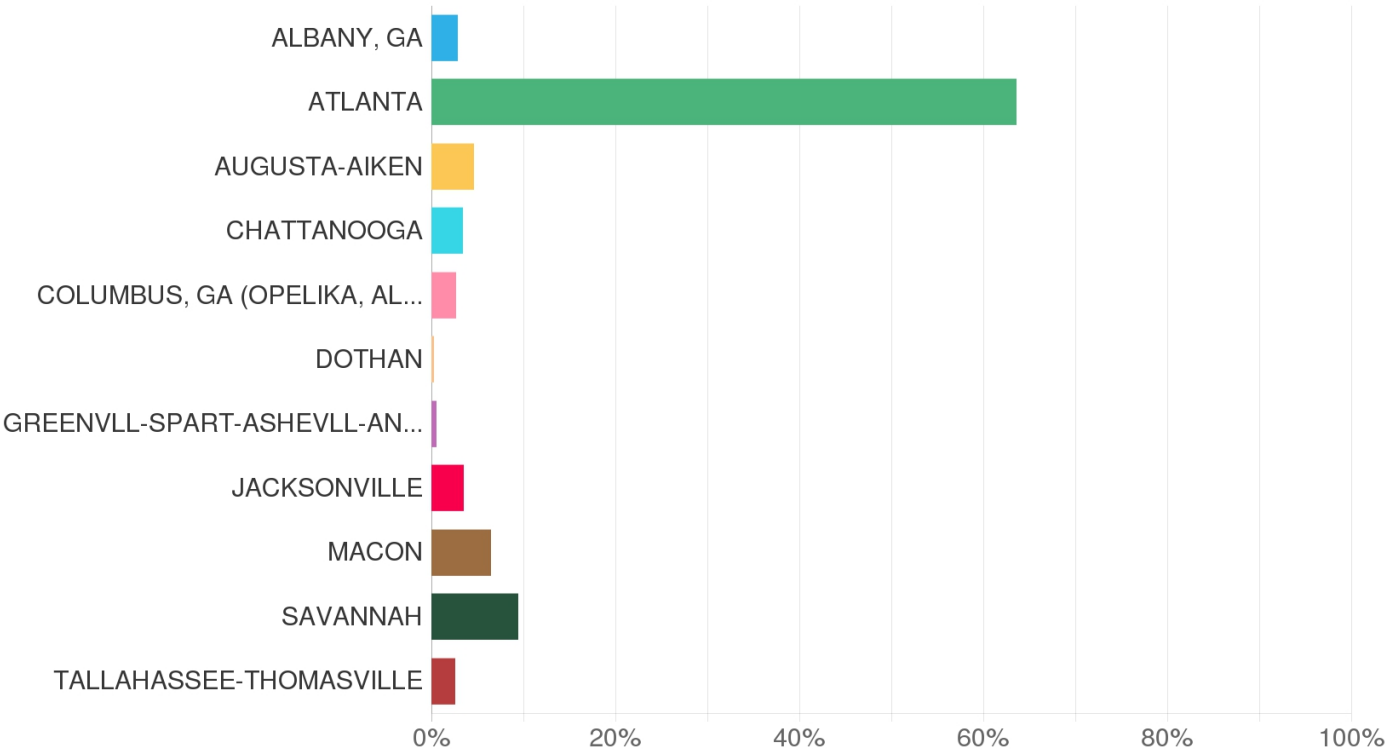
