The VA Statewide APP Survey was conducted by IVR and Online Mobile Interviews from July 6 - July 9 among a random sample of 600 likely voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

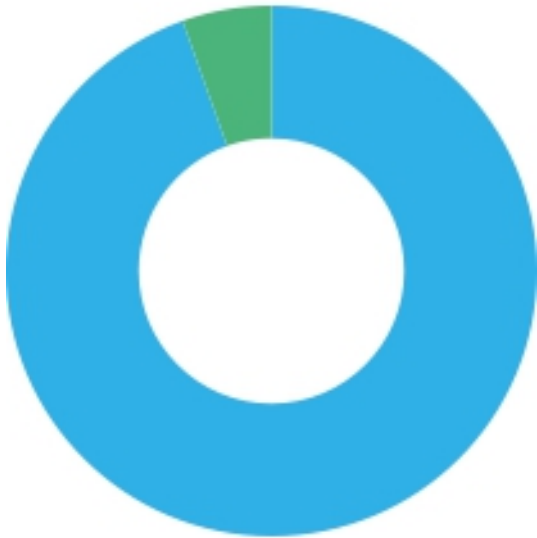

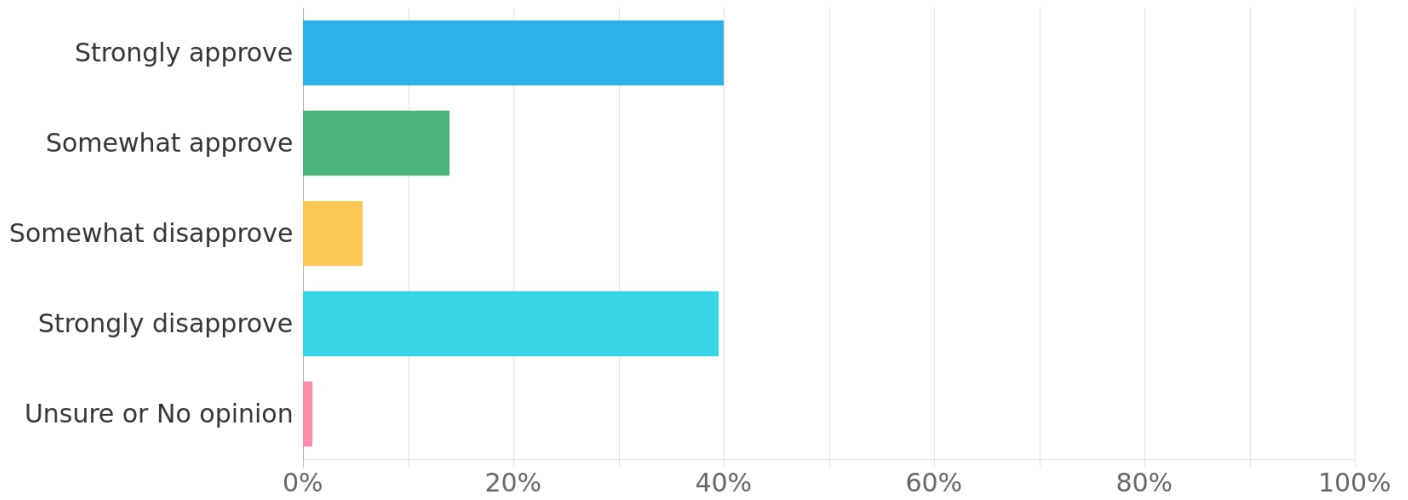

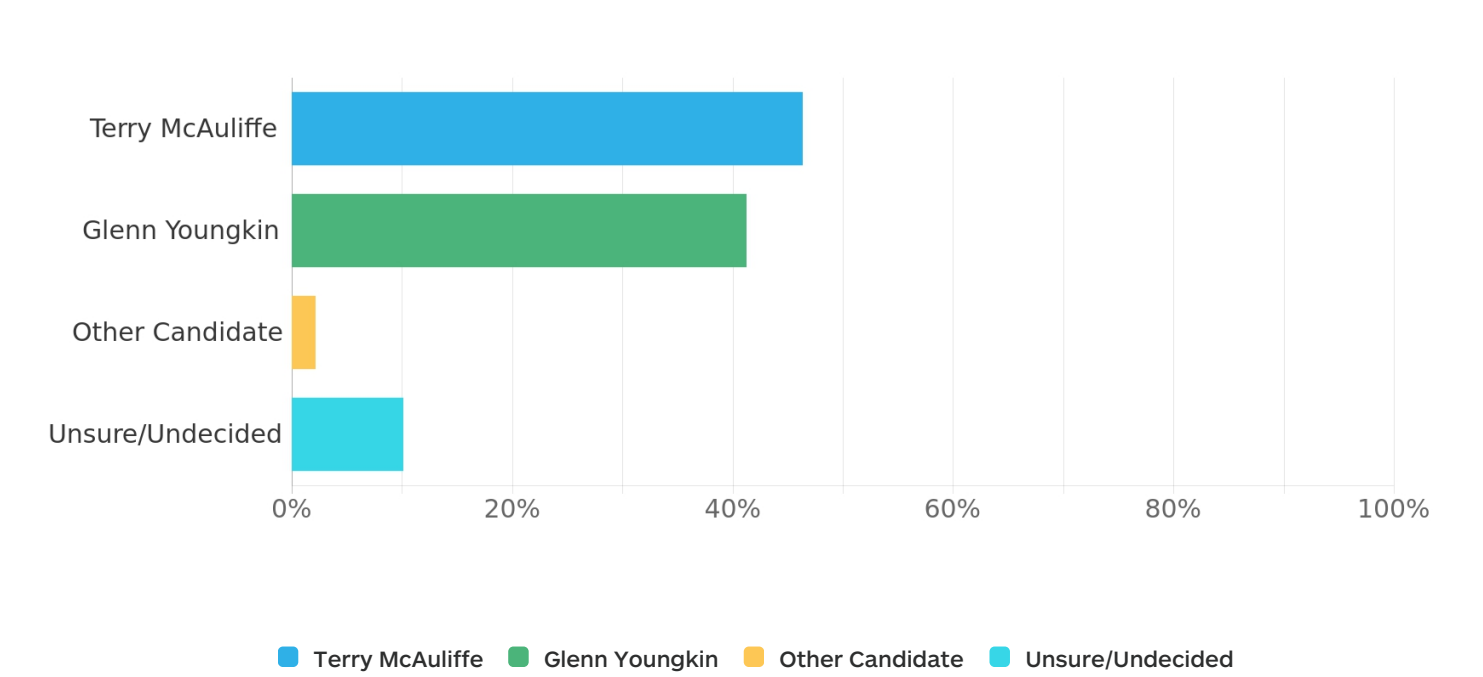

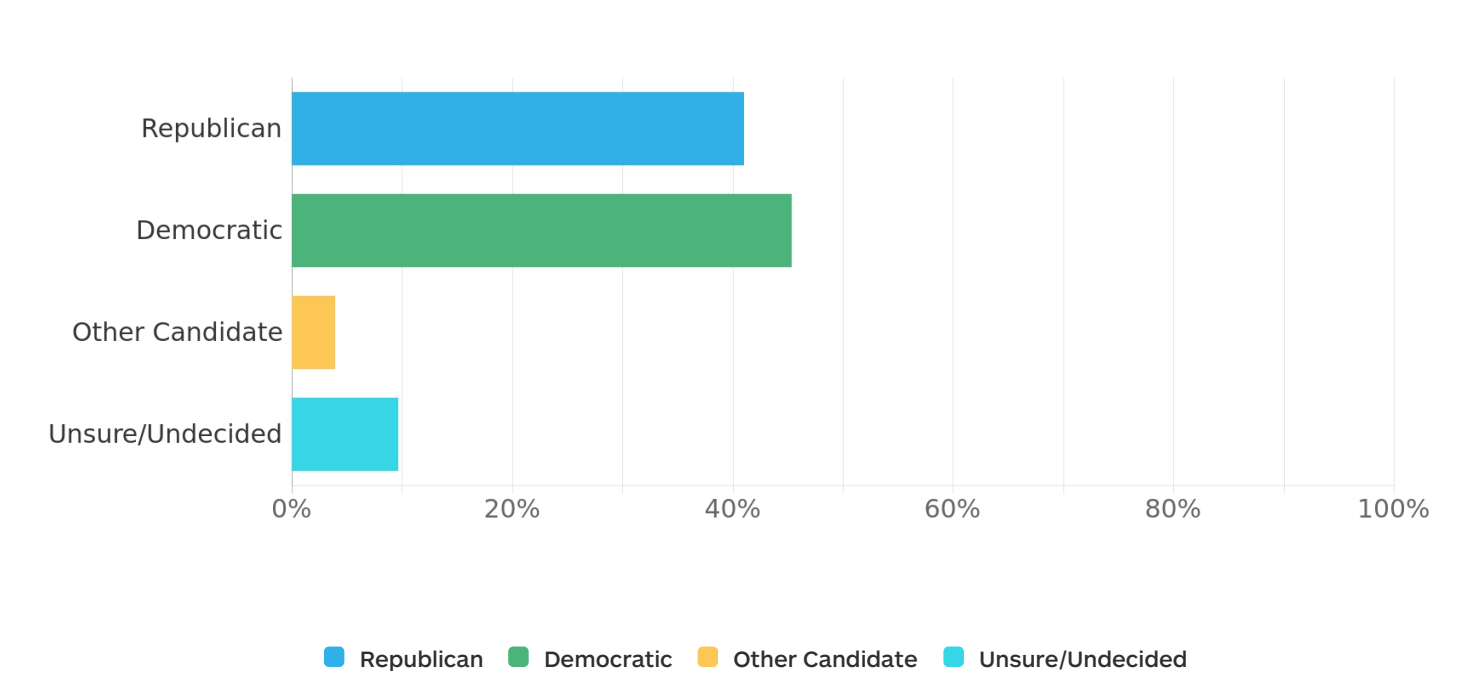

If the November 2nd General Election for your local State Delegate, are you planning to vote for the Republican candidate or the Democratic candidate?

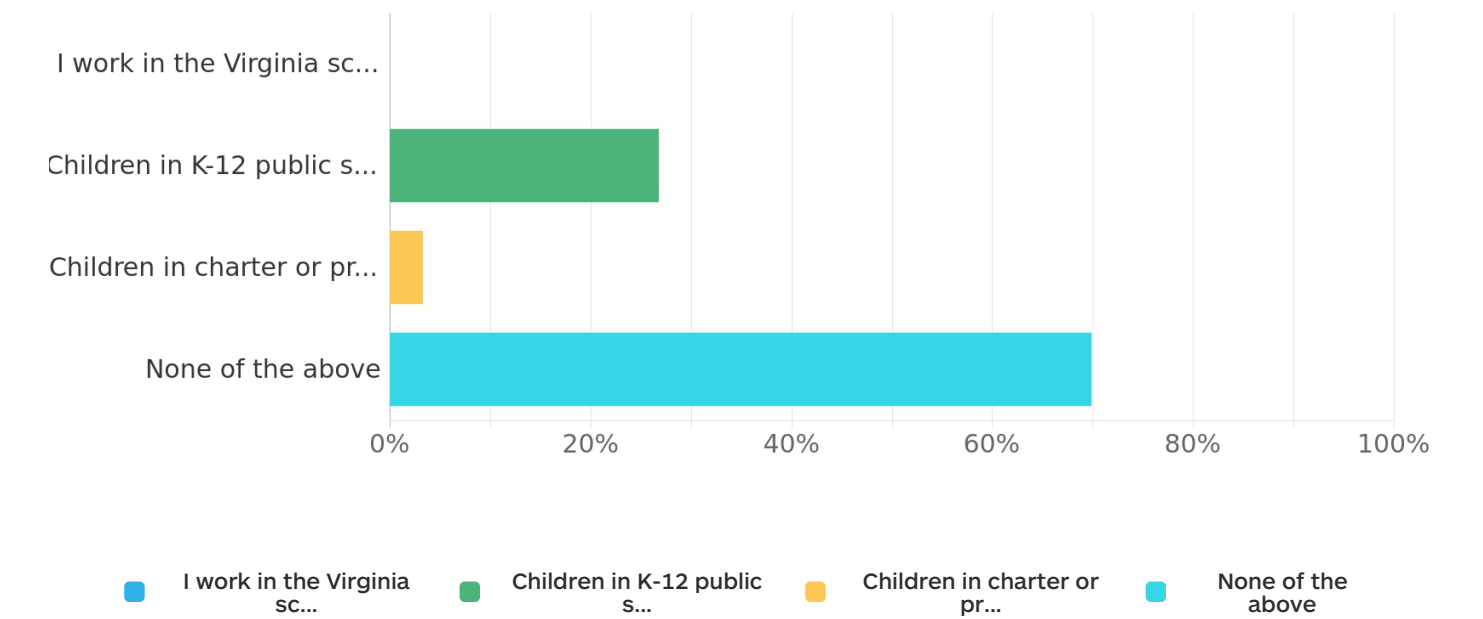

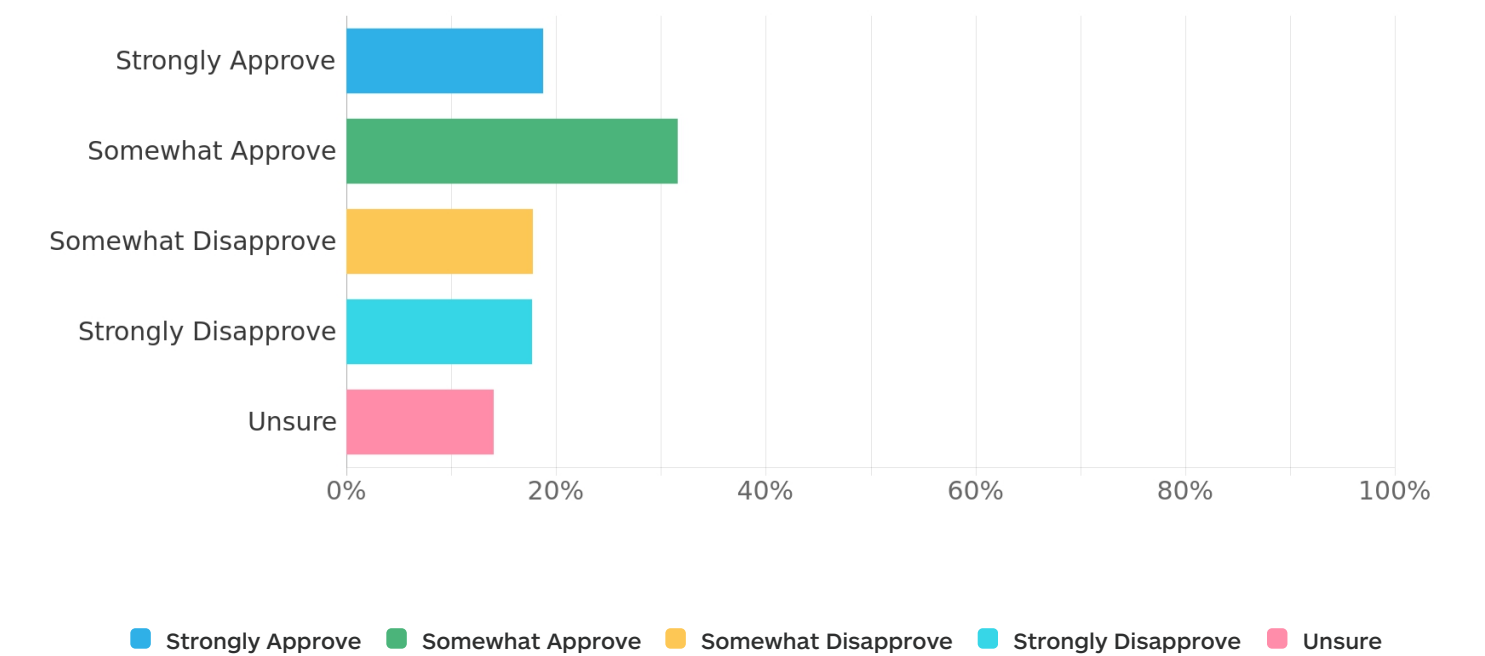

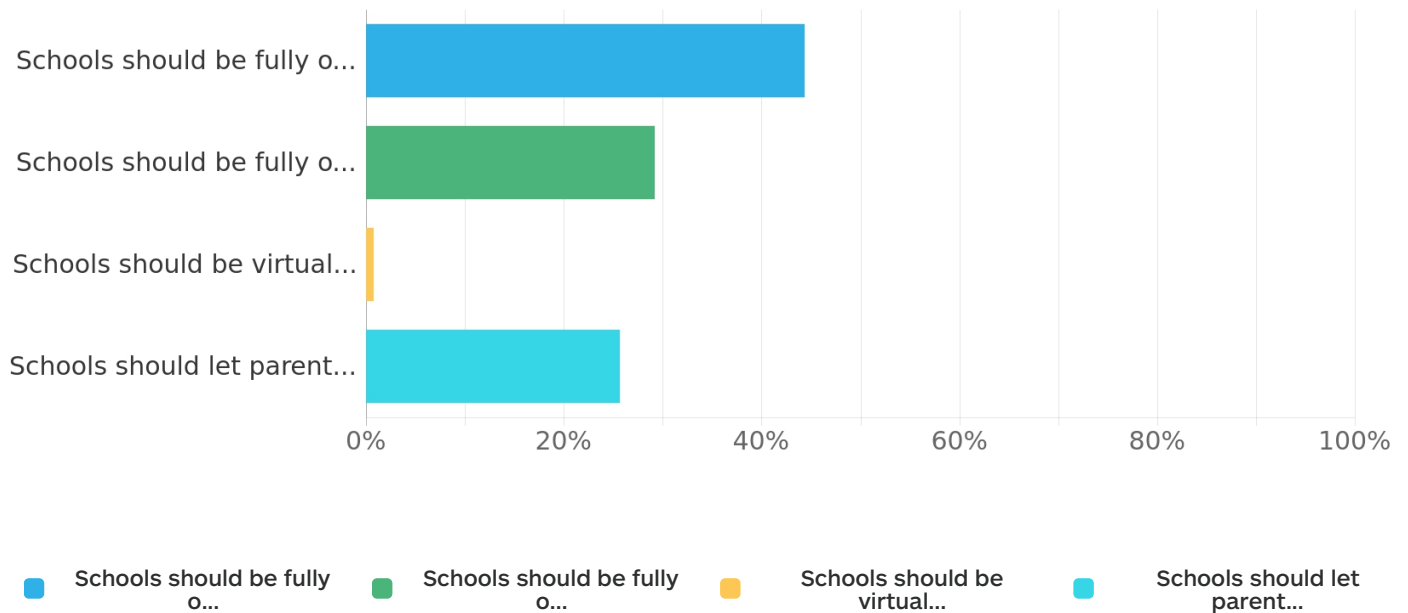

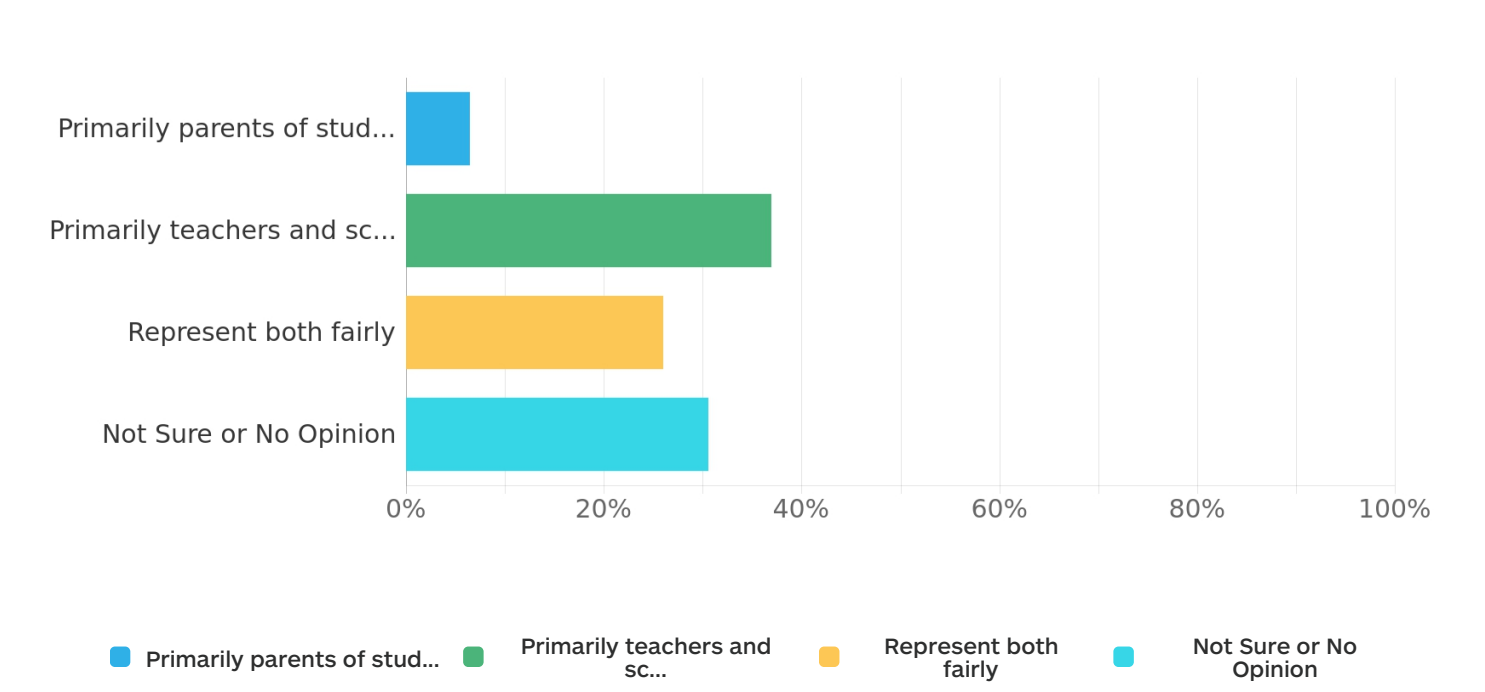

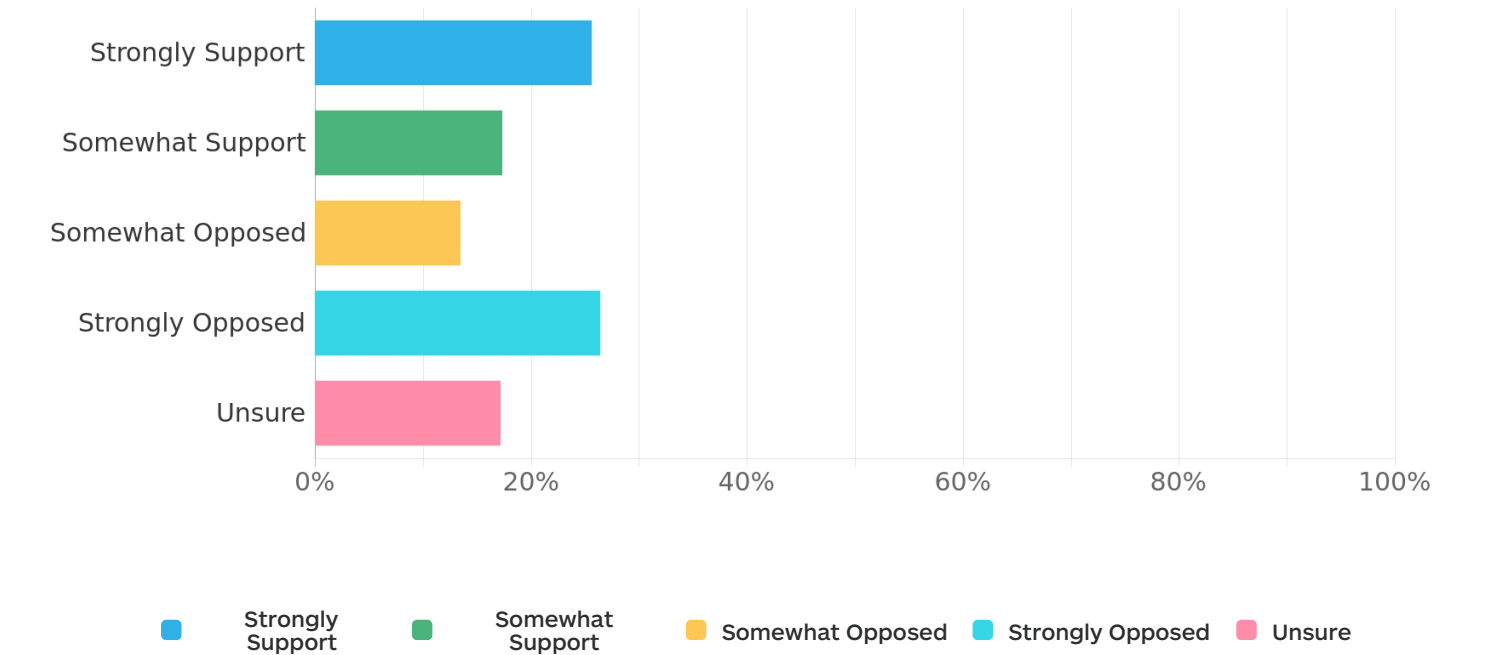

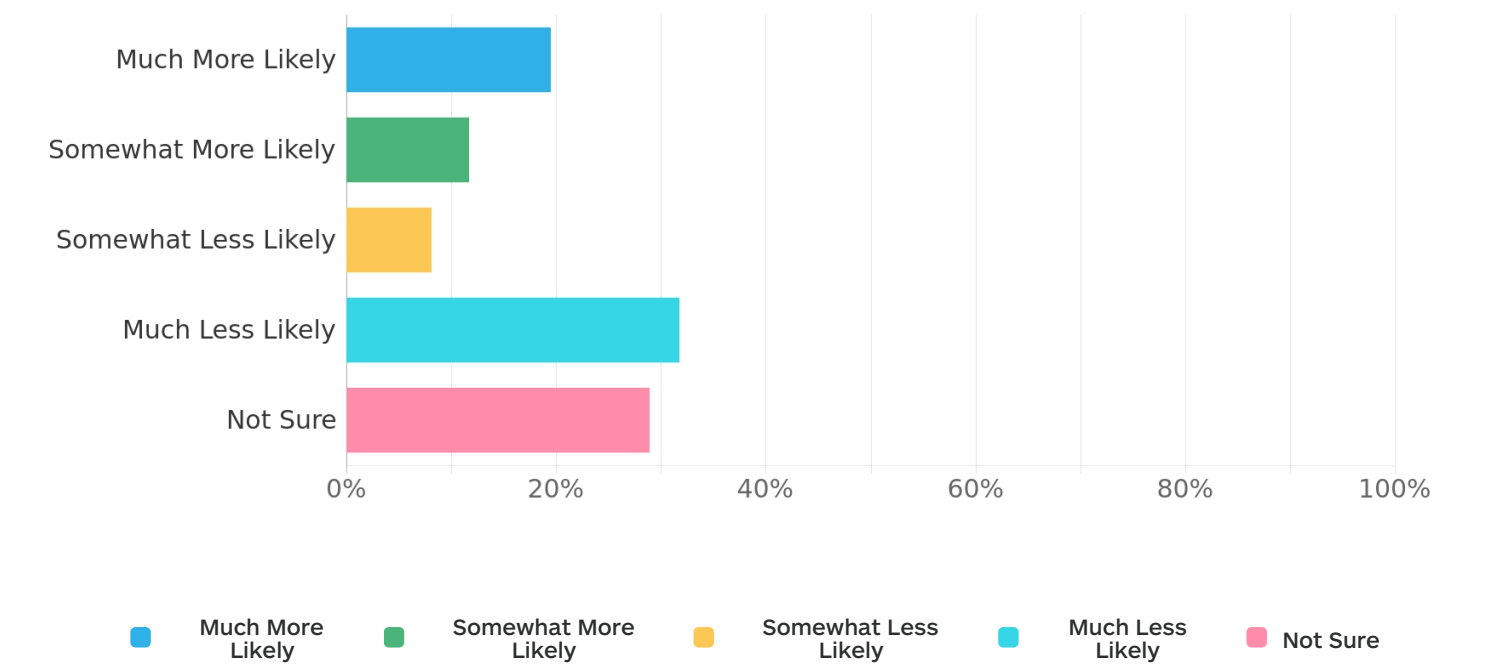

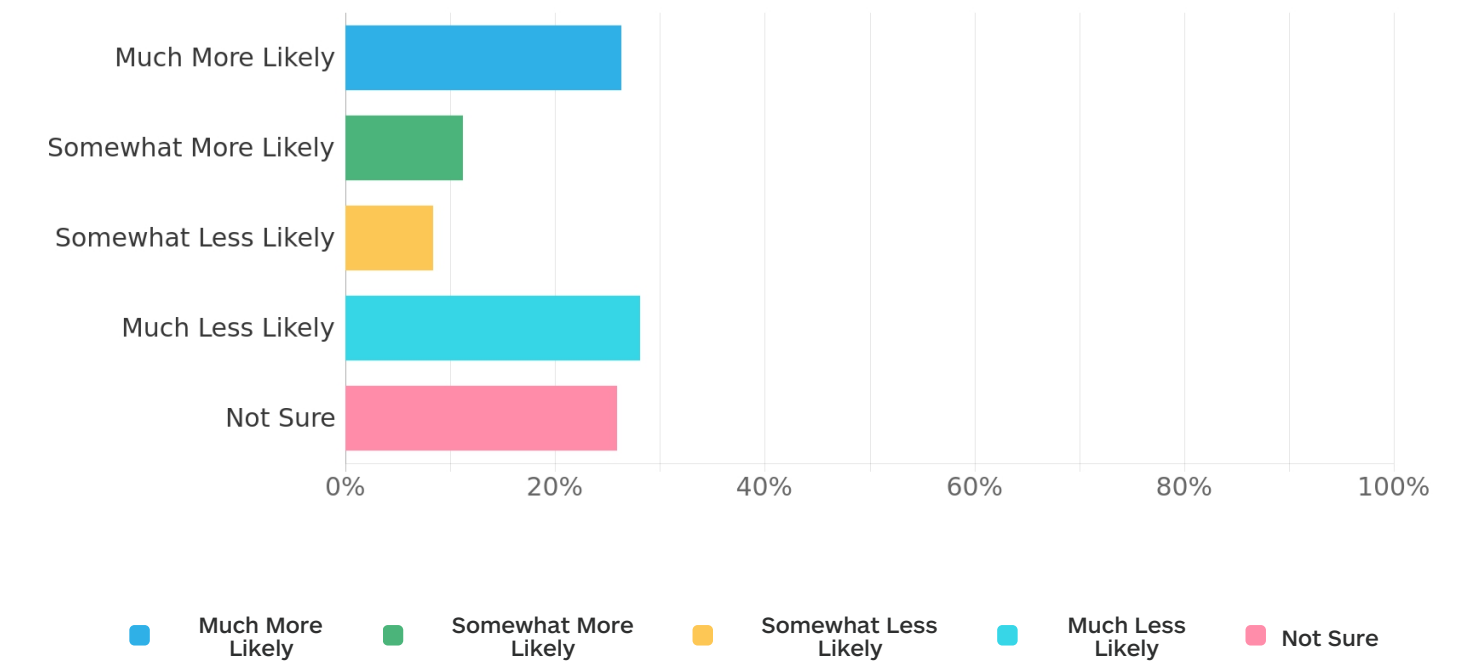

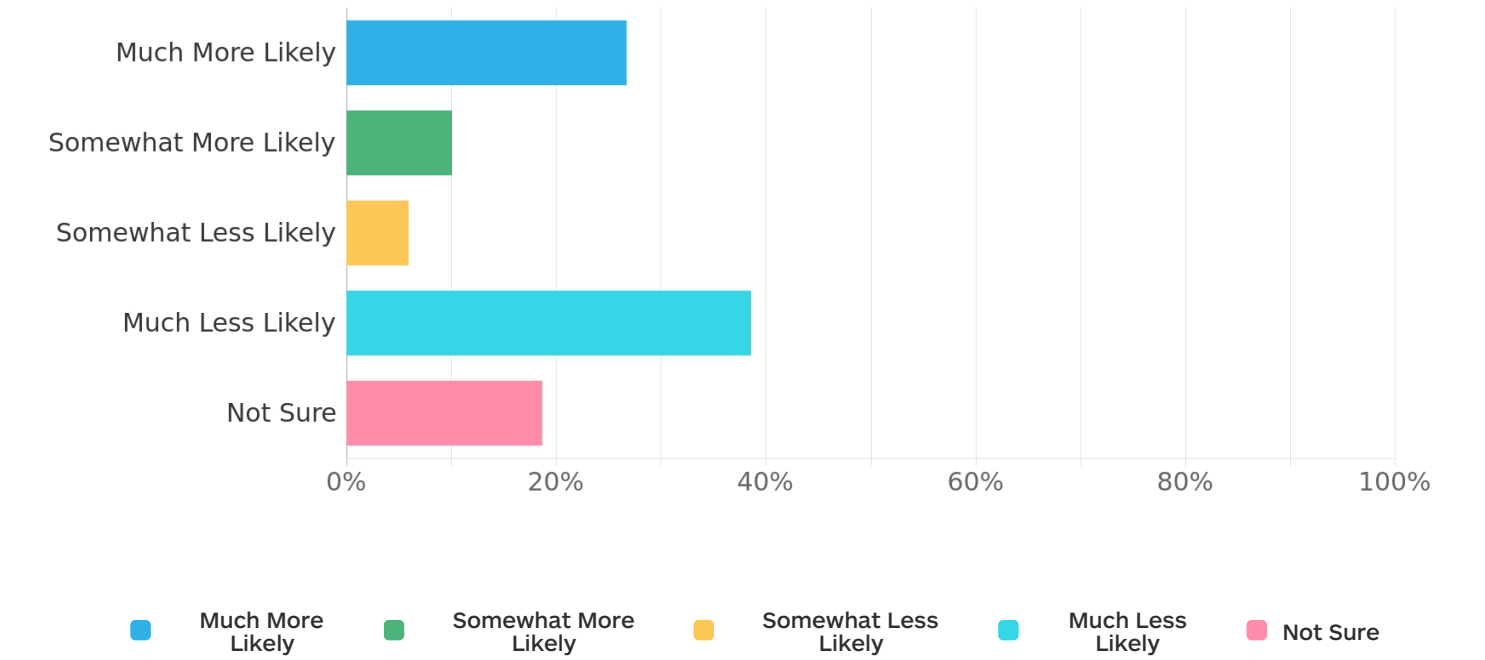

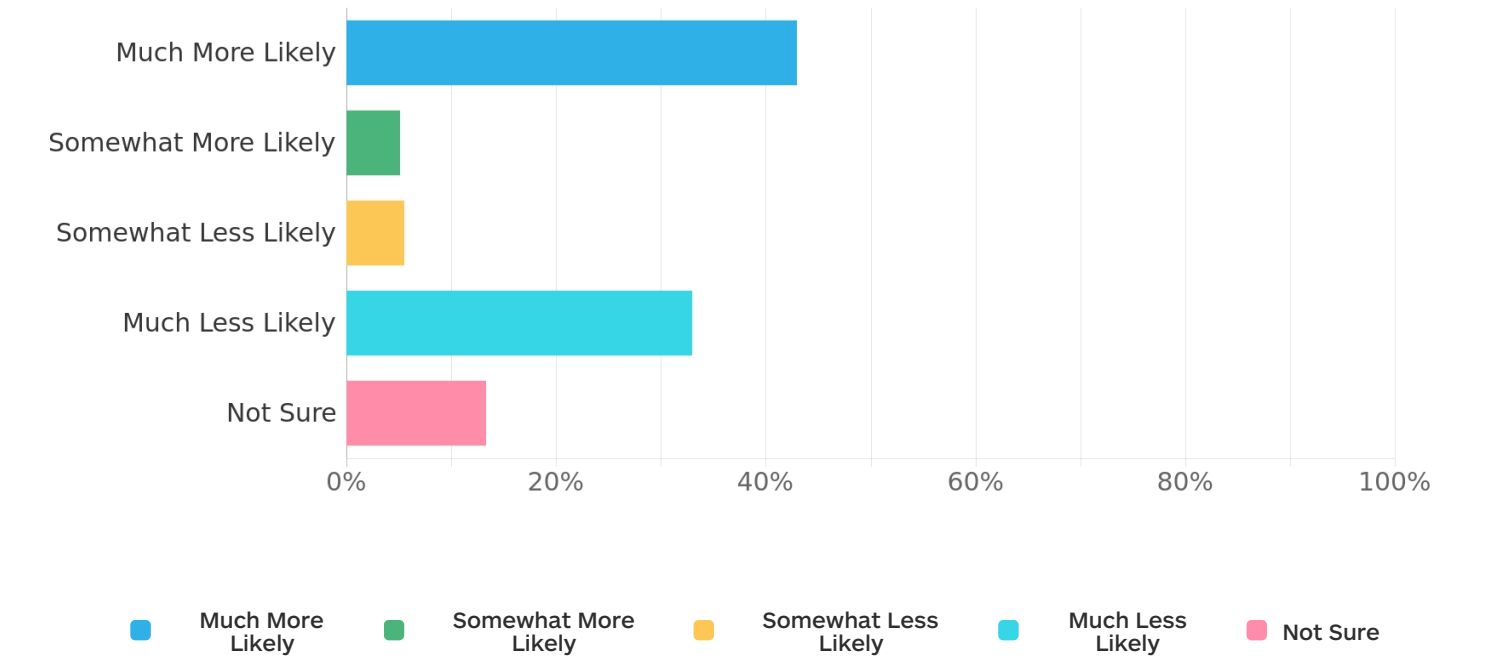

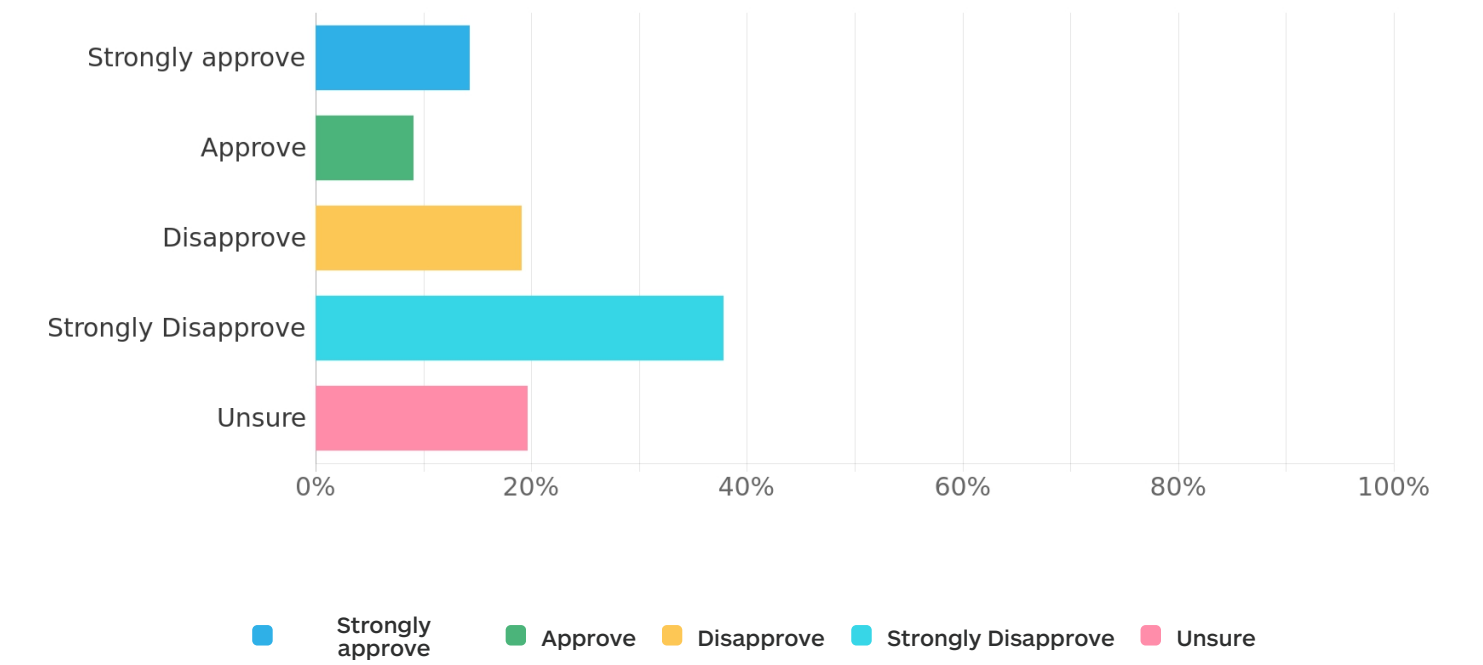

Do you approve of policies that would allow biologically male students that identify as transgender to participate in girls’ sports programs at Virginia K-12 public schools?

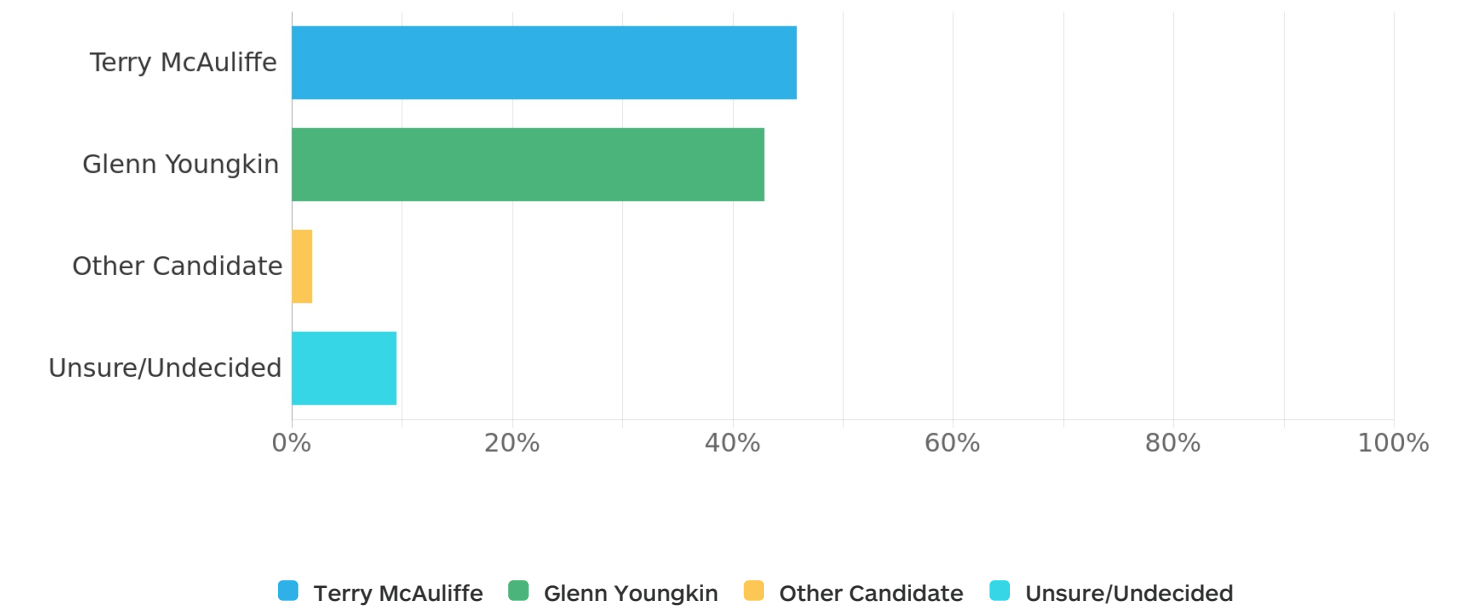

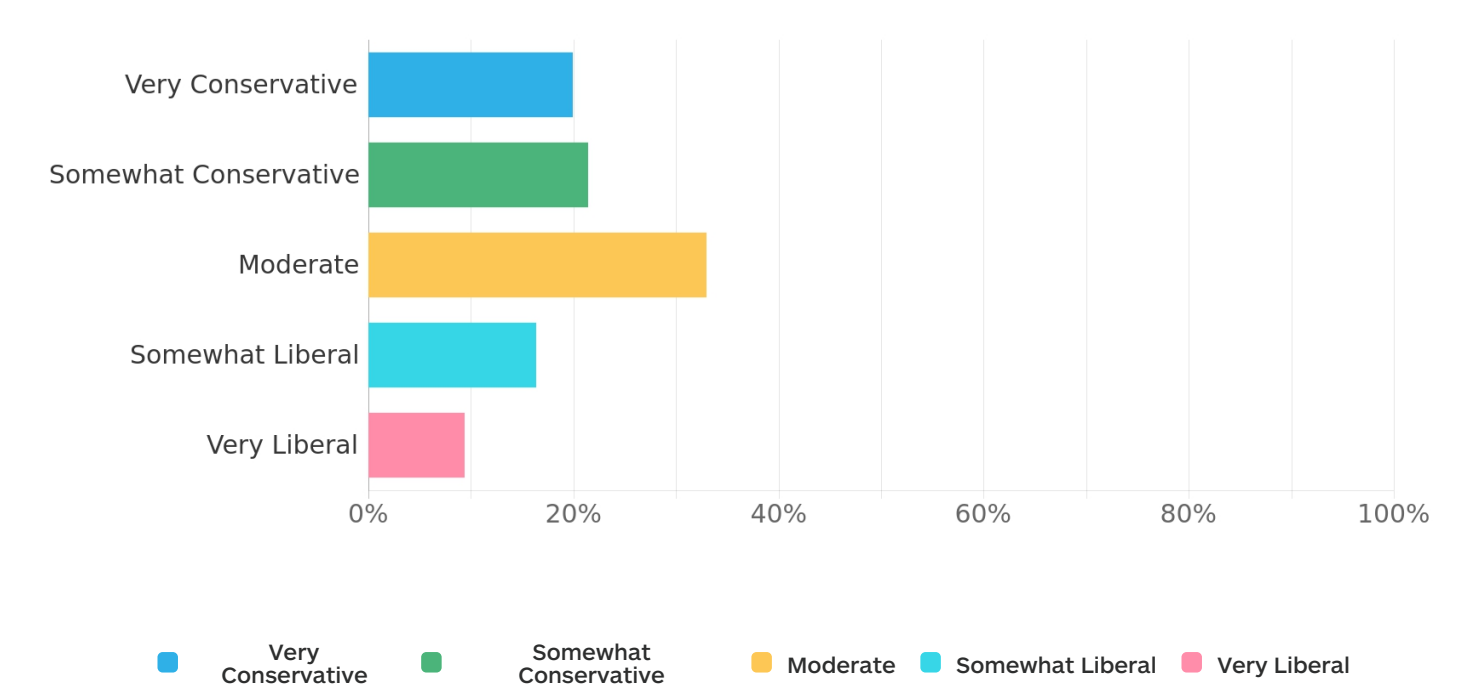

Do you consider yourself to be Very Conservative, Somewhat Conservative, Moderate, Somewhat Liberal or Very Liberal?

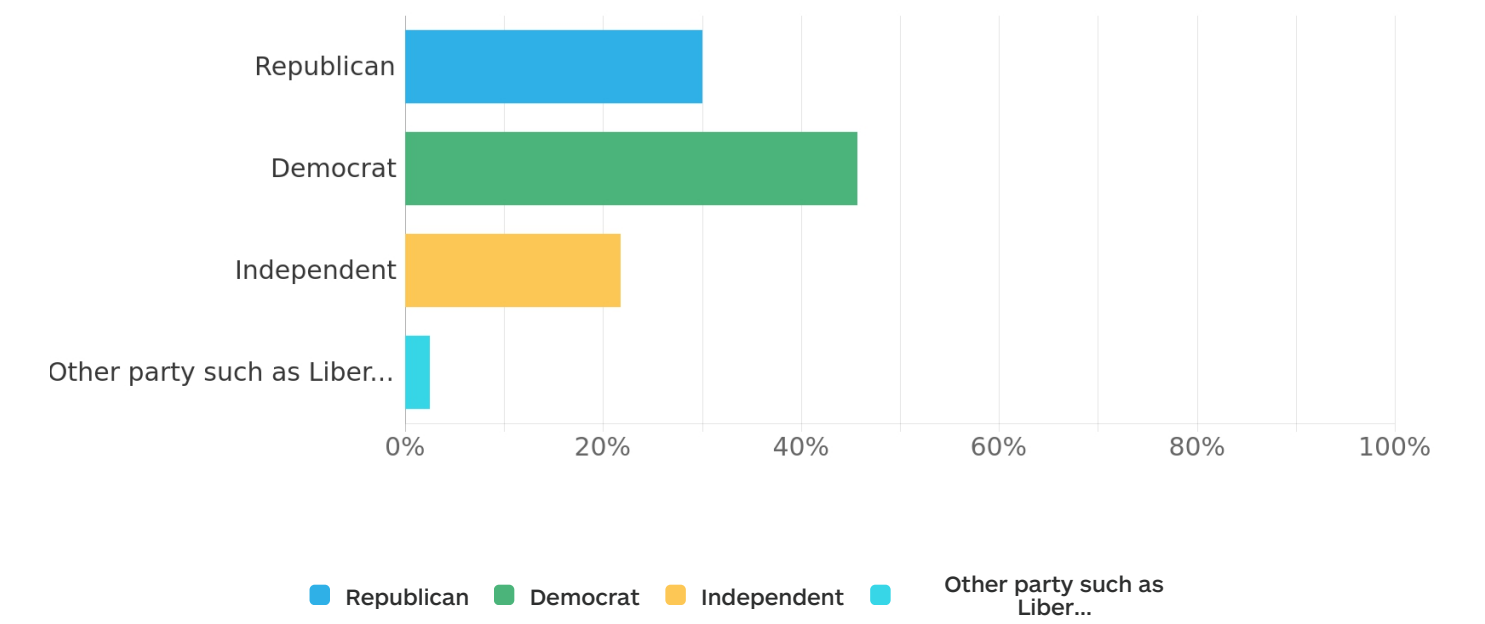

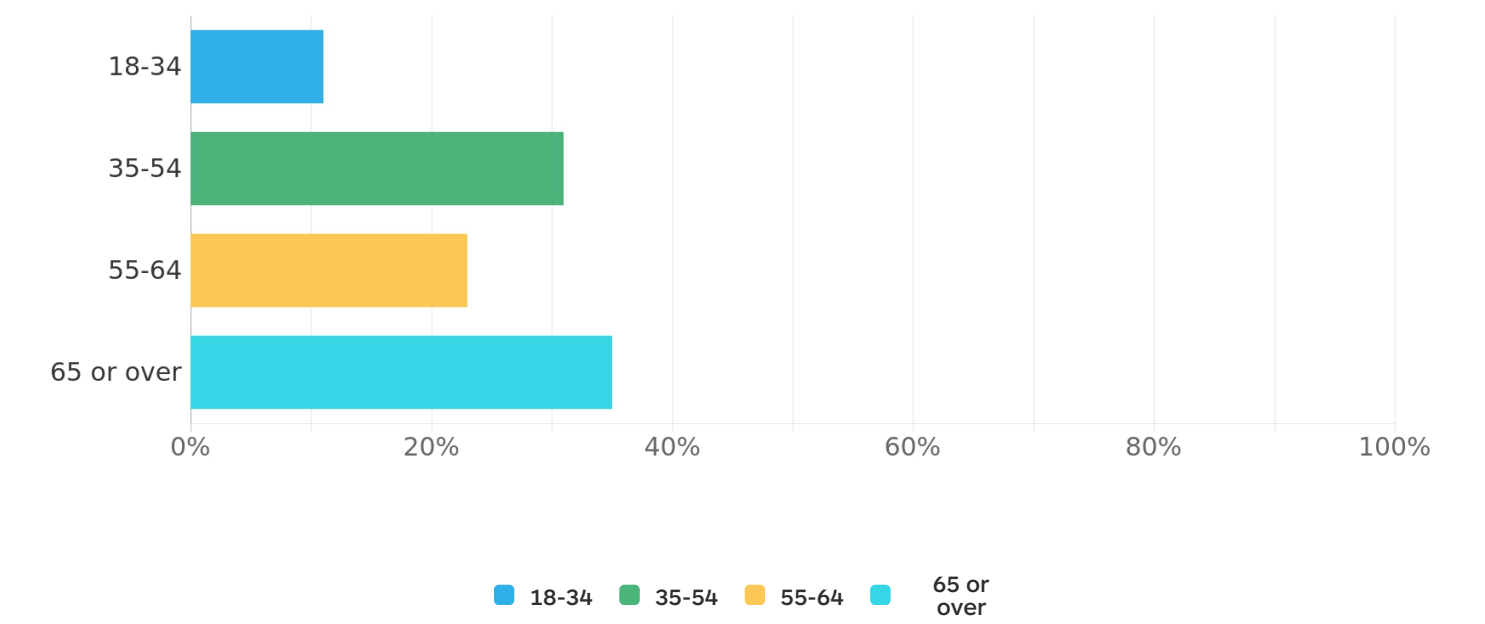

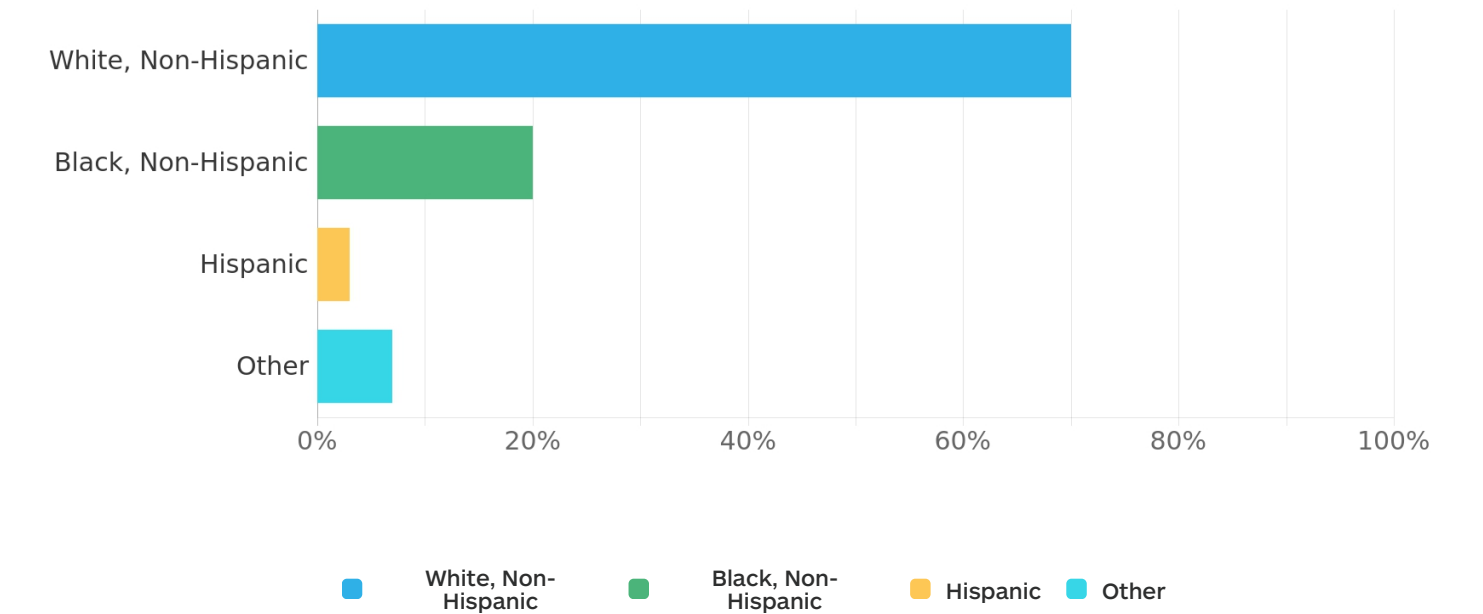

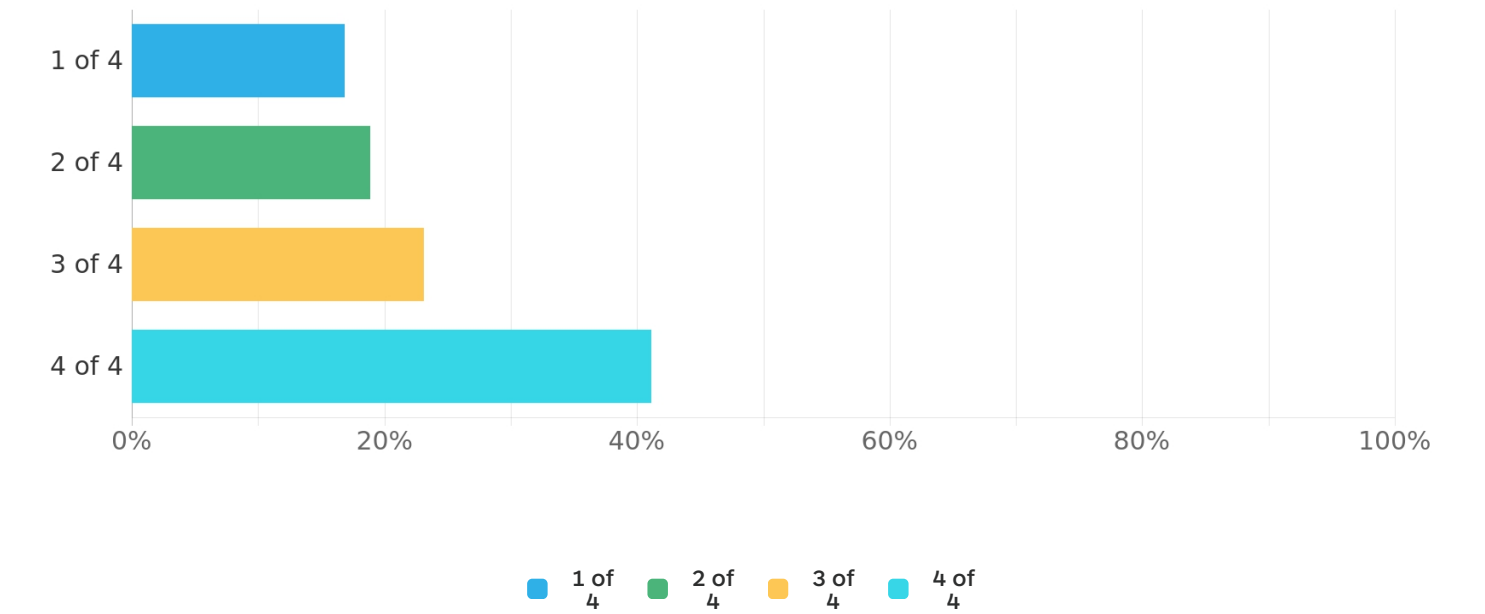

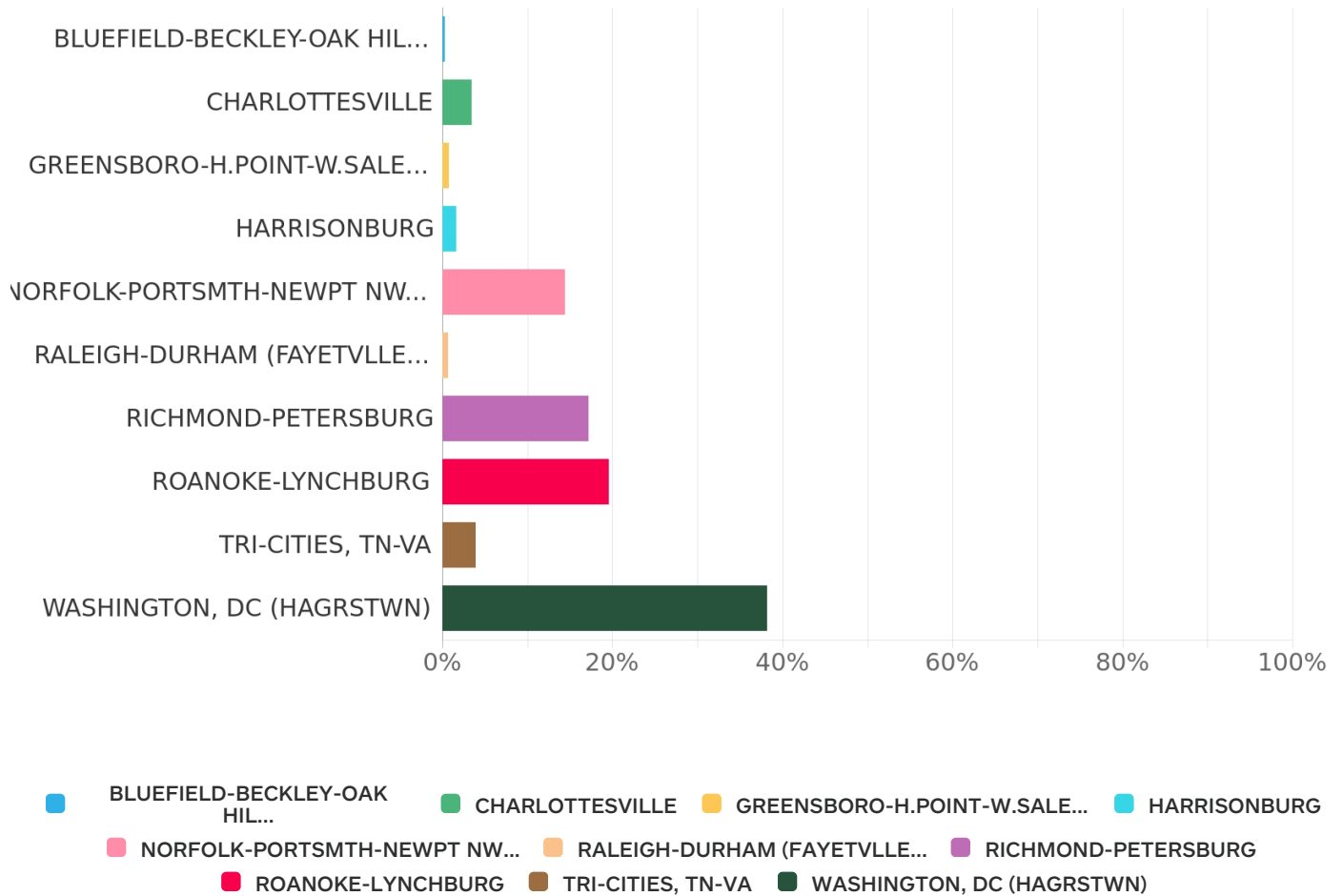

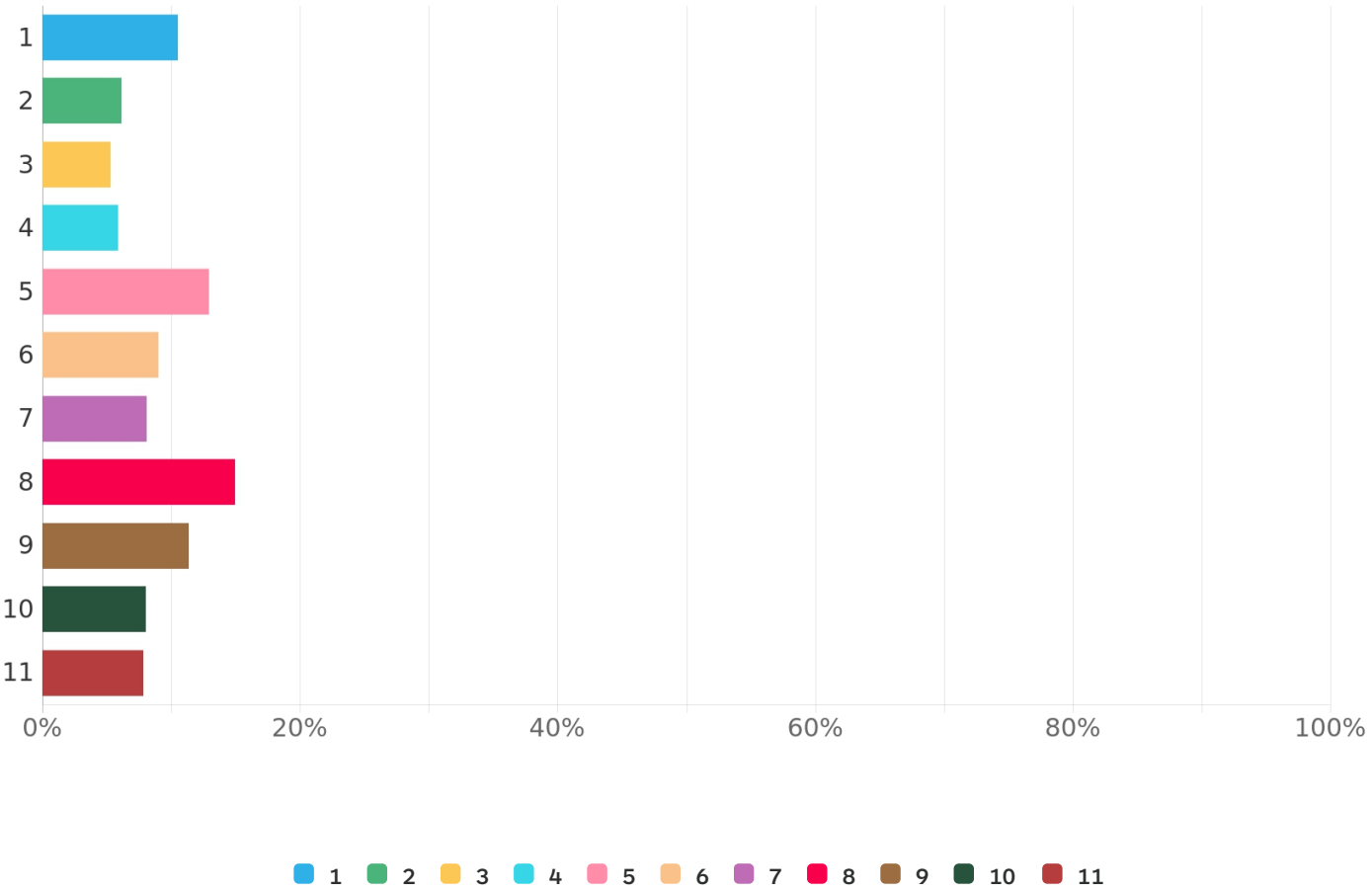
