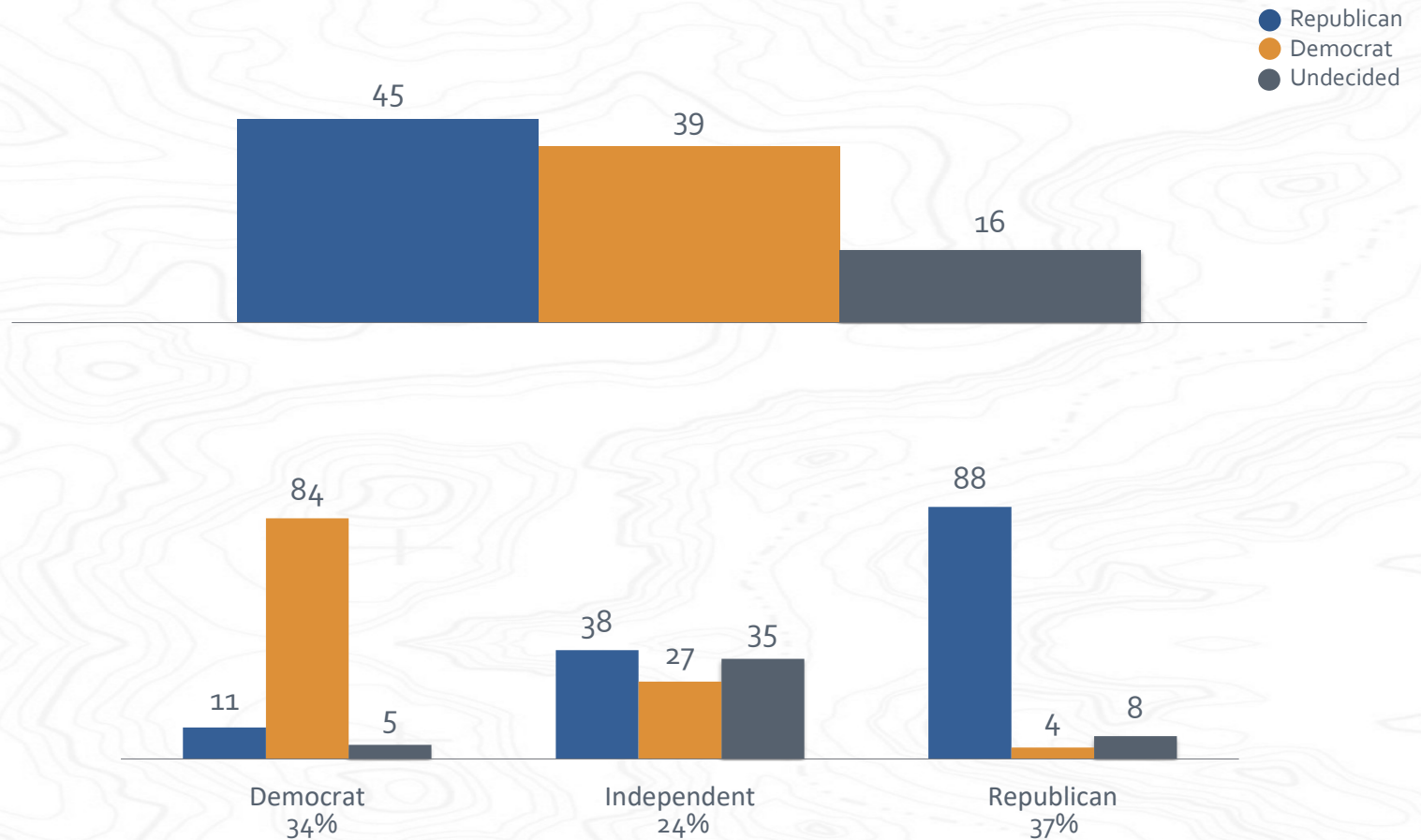

## SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The following battleground survey was conducted by OnMessage Inc. in 6 Senate battleground states. Telephone interviews were conducted on May 2-6, 2022. This survey consists of 1200 likely general election voters and was stratified to reflect historical voter trends. The margin of error for this survey is +/- 2.82%.

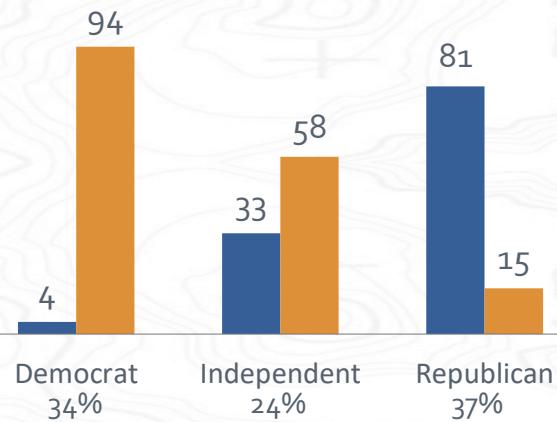
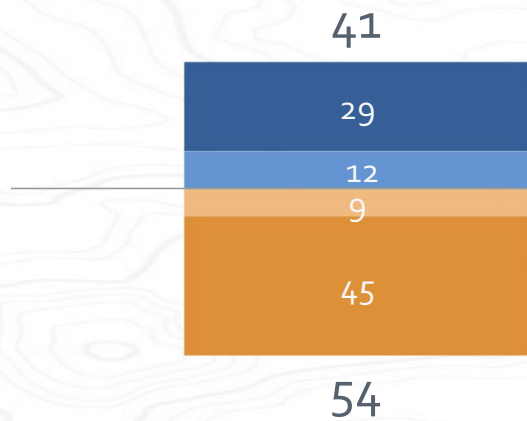
## GENERIC BALLOT

If the 2022 election for U.S. Congress were held today, for whom would you vote, the Republican candidate or the Democrat candidate?

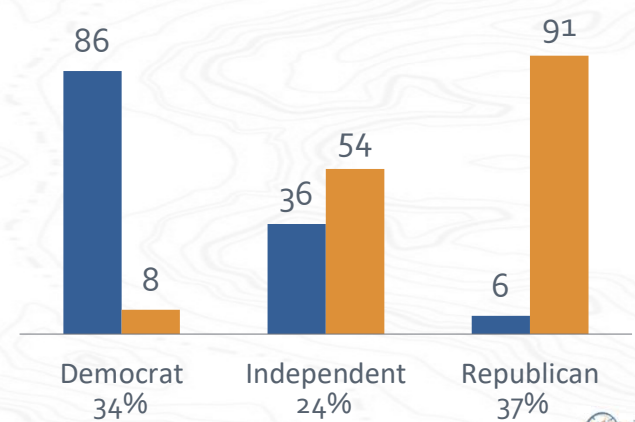
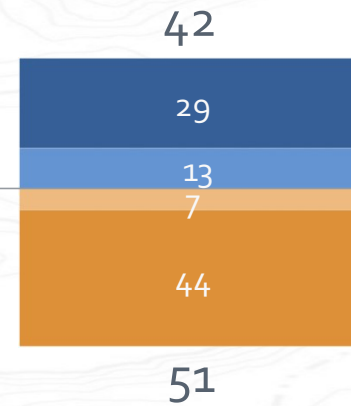

Other people say that trans women are women, and that not allowing them to compete with the gender they identify with is unfair discrimination.

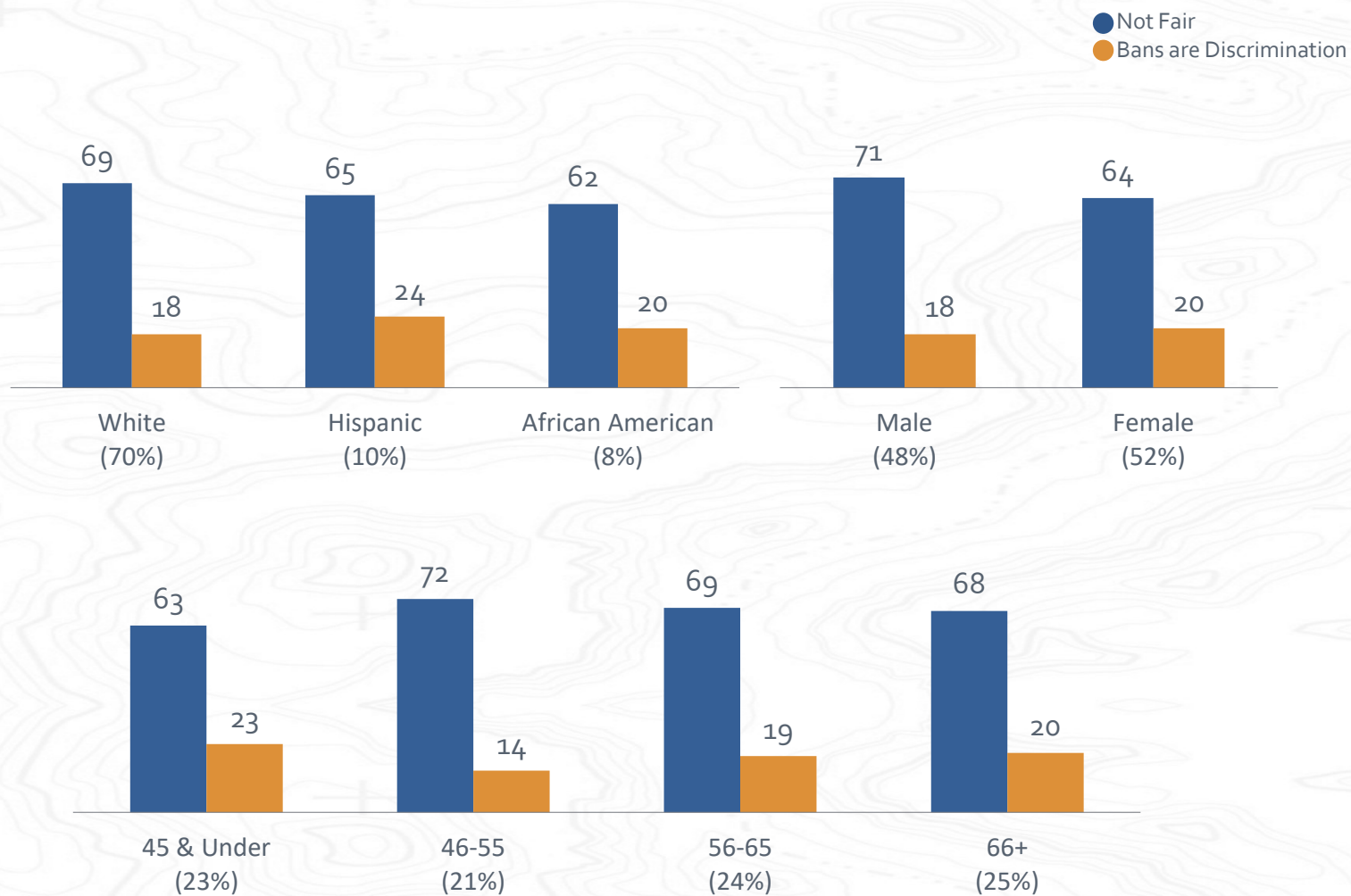

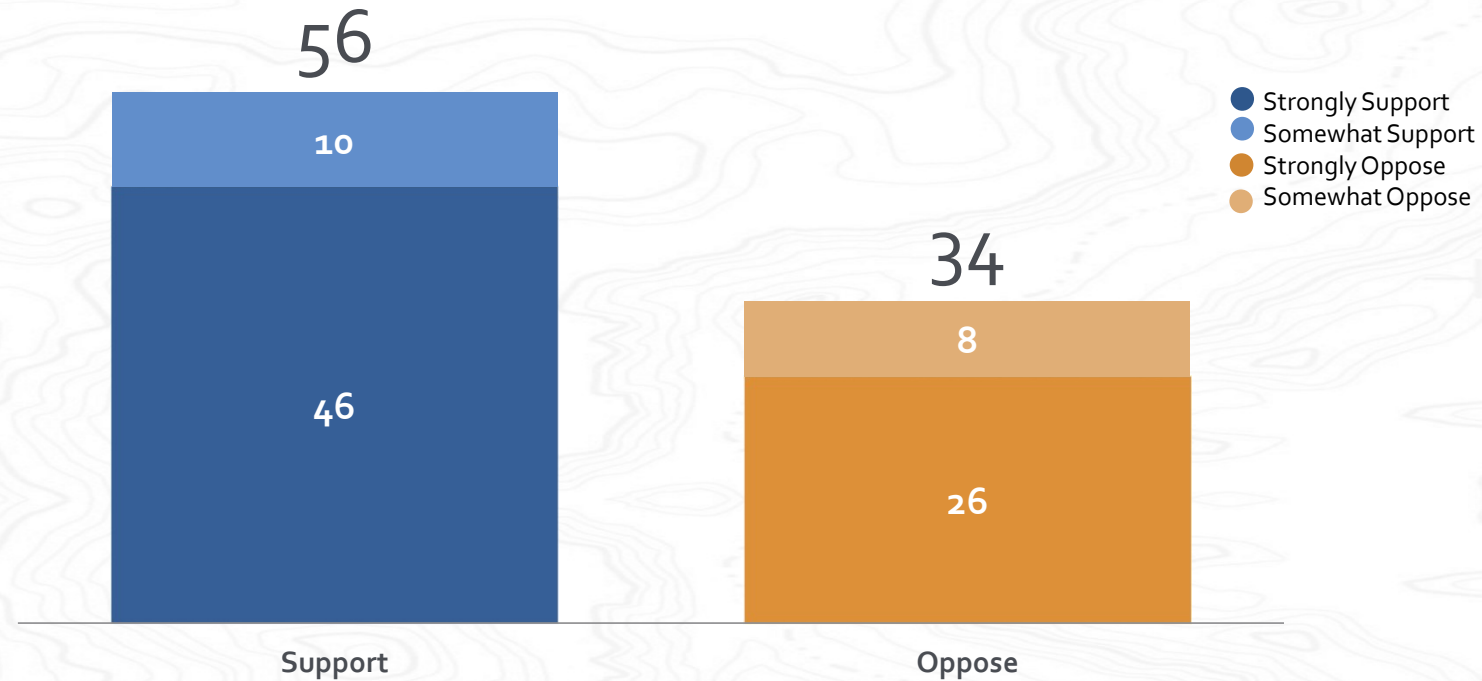

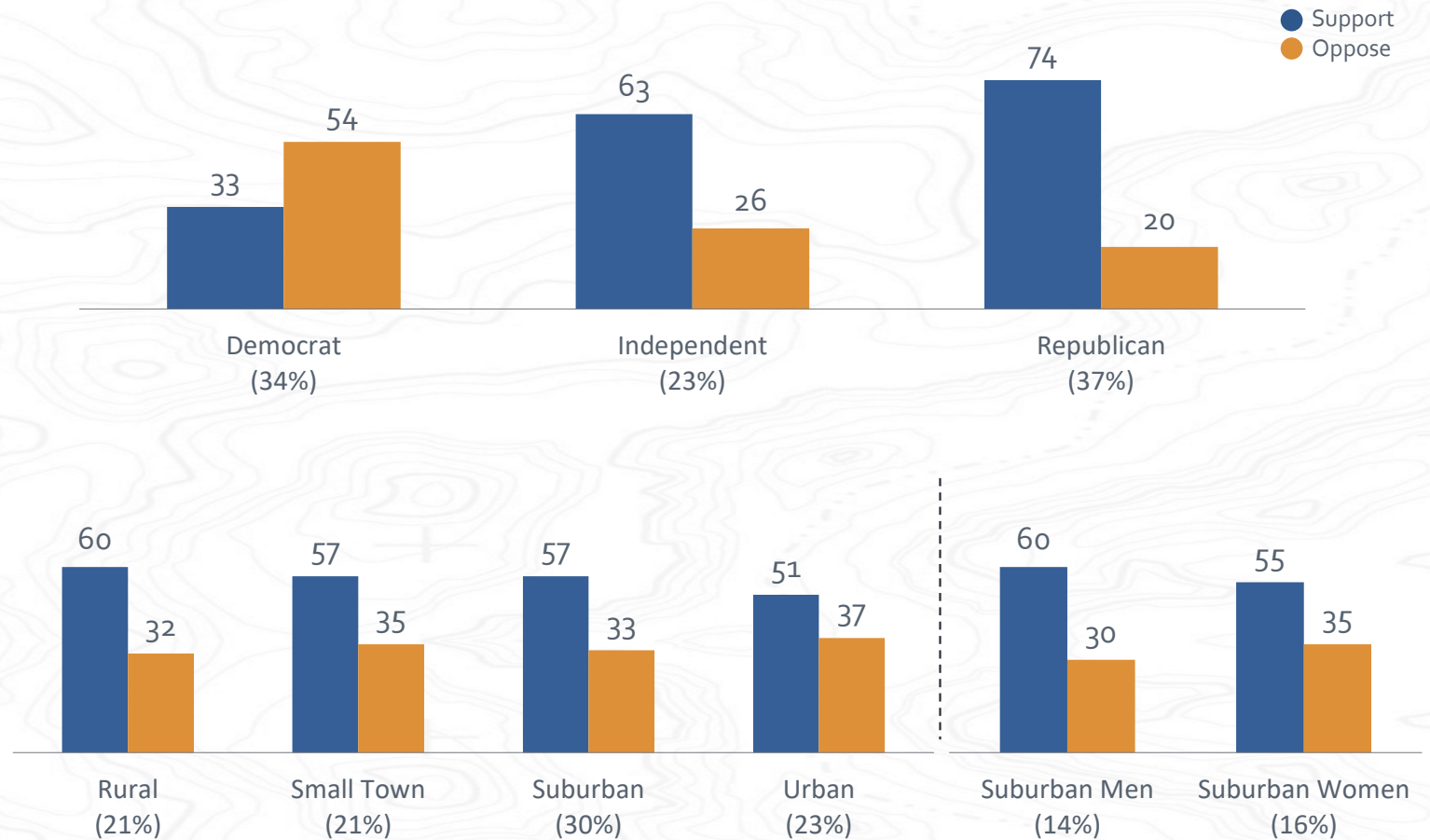
## YOUTH PUBERTY BLOCKER BAN

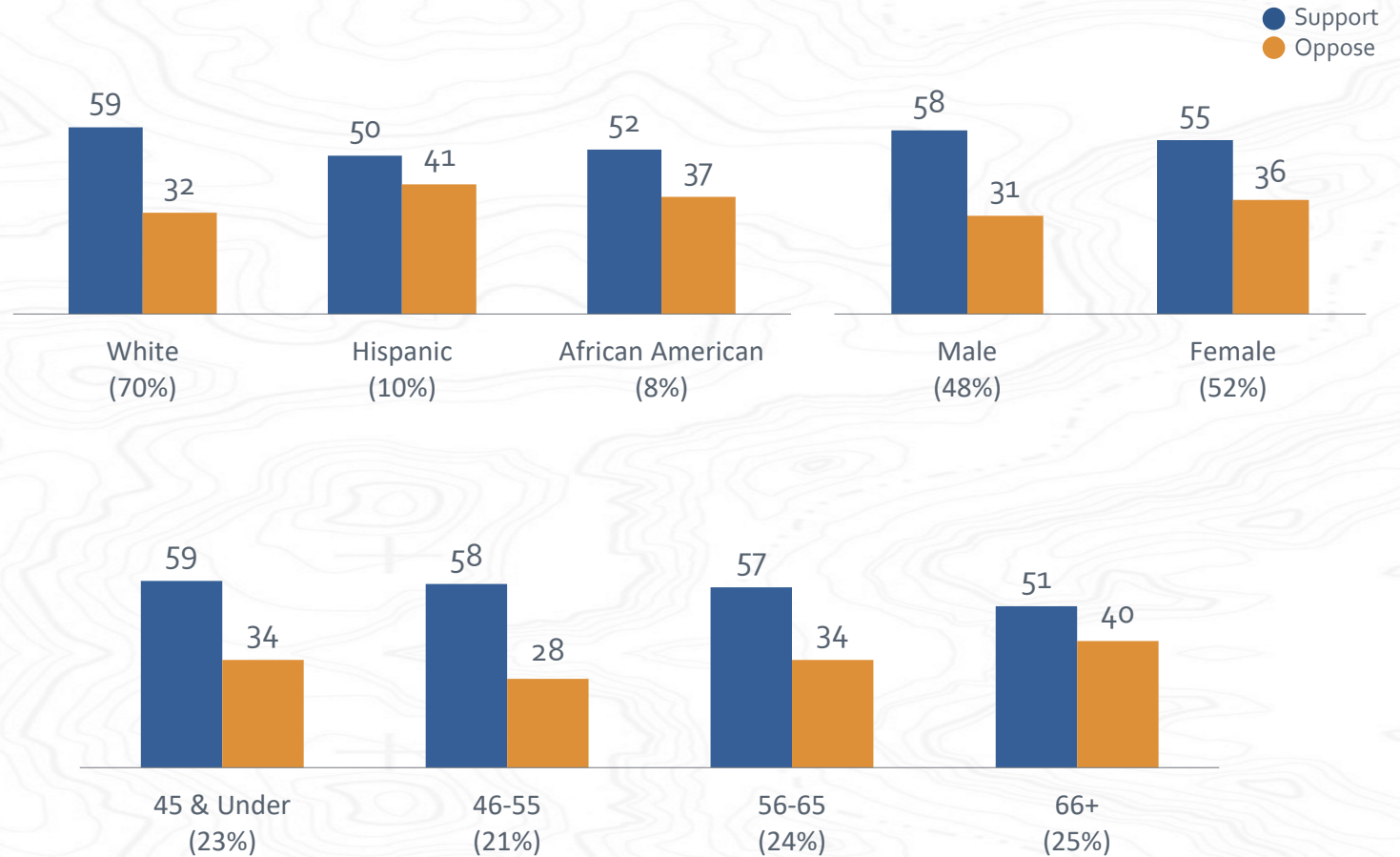

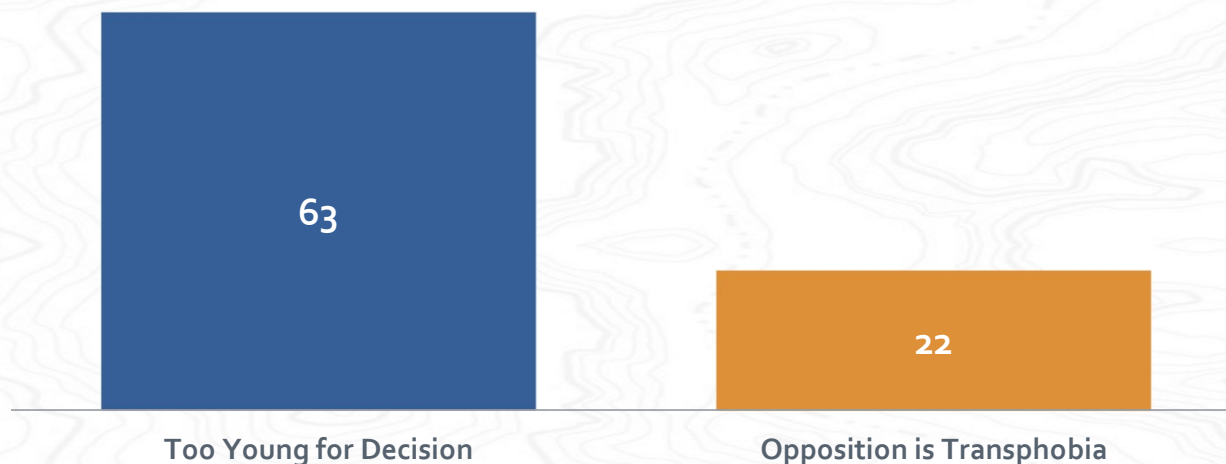

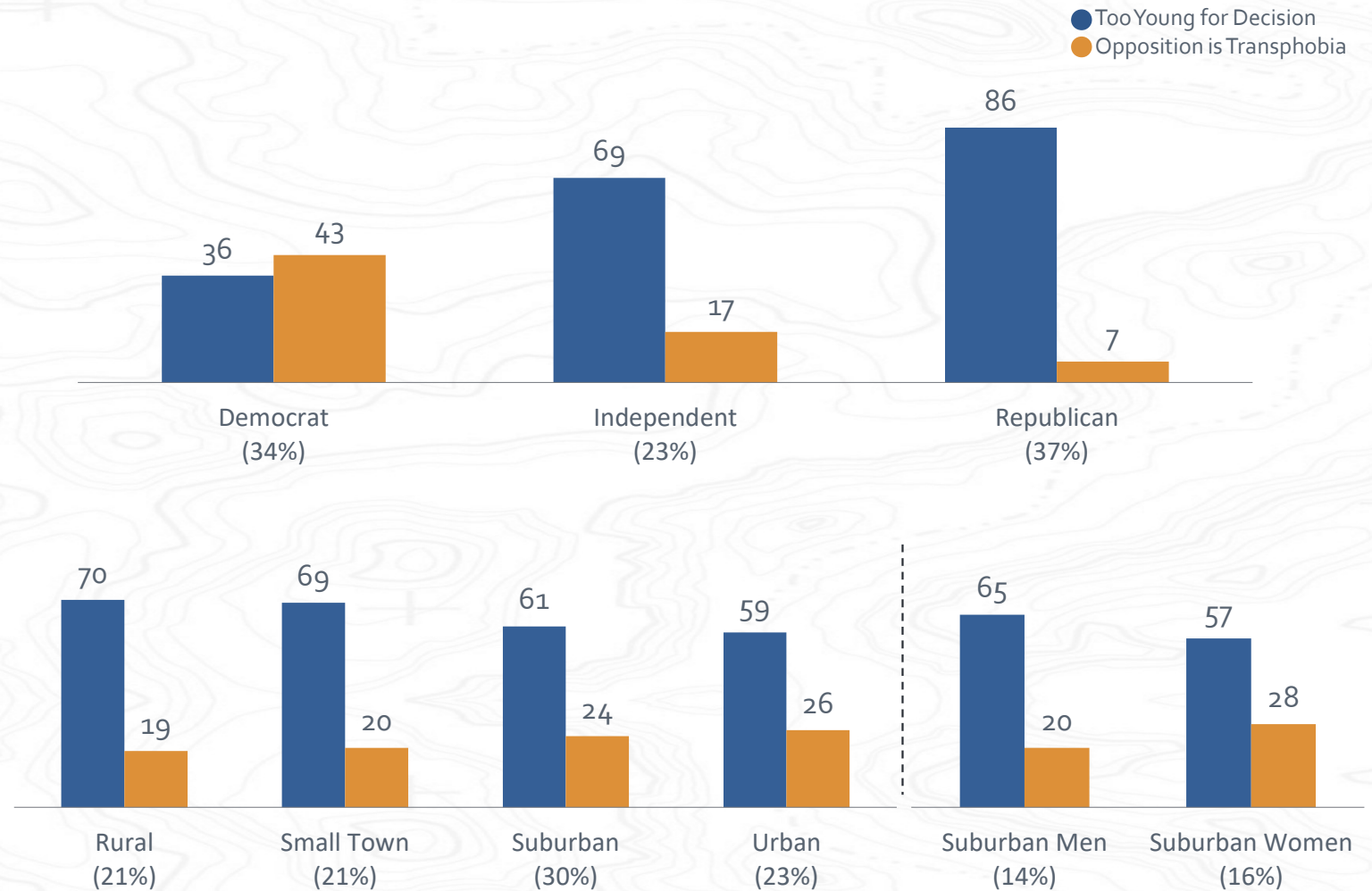

Specifically, about whether to allow them to take puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, and undergo physical surgeries to aid a gender transition from male to female or female to male. With this in mind please tell me which of the following comes closest to your opinion.

Some people say it is wrong to push children into a sex change. They say that children are not able to make such a life altering decision at such a young age, and that many often regret it later in life. They also say that even the early stages of transition cause permanent physical changes and bodily harm, including sterilization and other medical complications.

Other people say that allowing transgender children to begin gender transitions at early ages is life-saving medical treatment, and that studies show that denying them access to this type of treatment could result in suicide. They say that people who oppose this practice are only doing so out of transphobia and bigotry

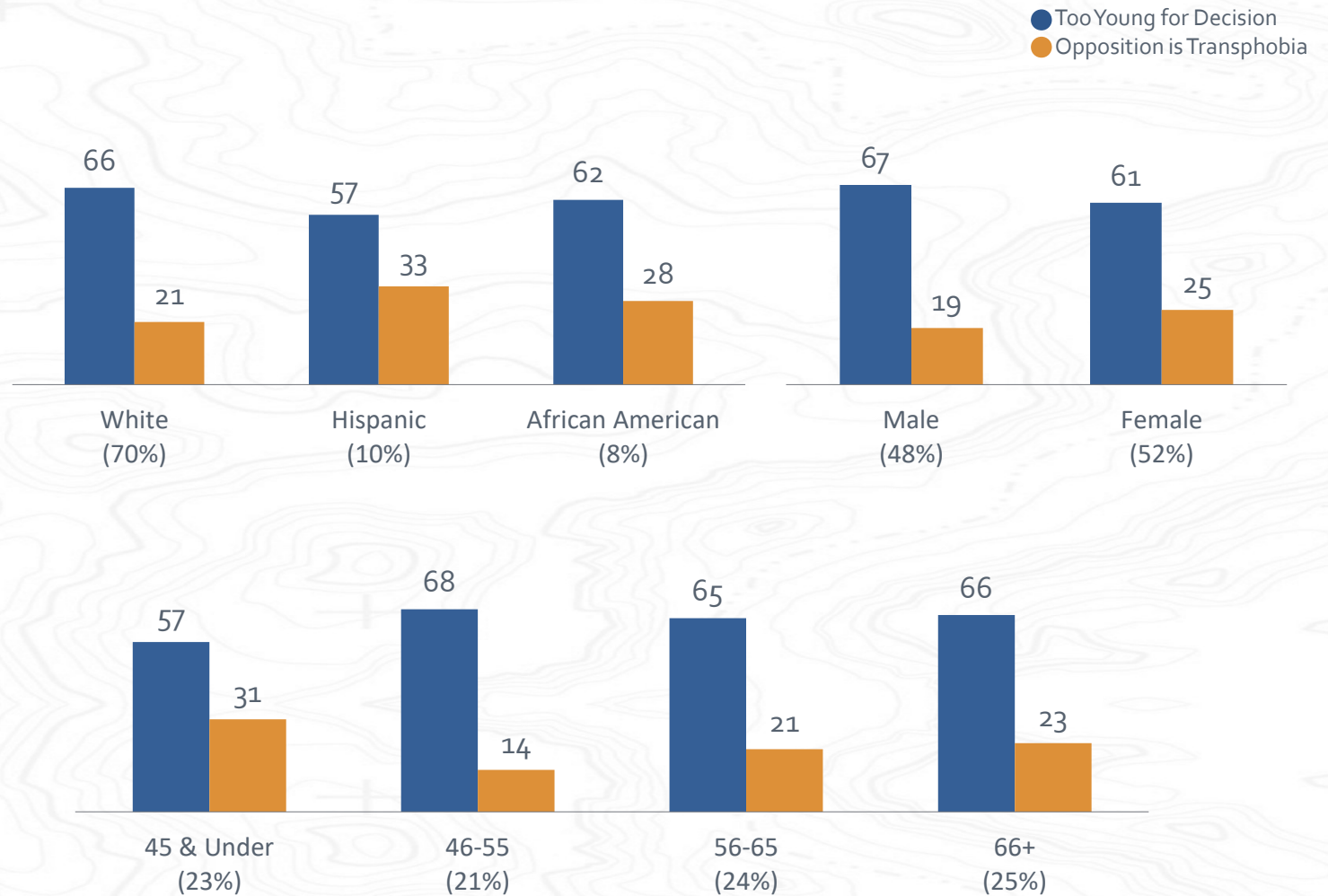

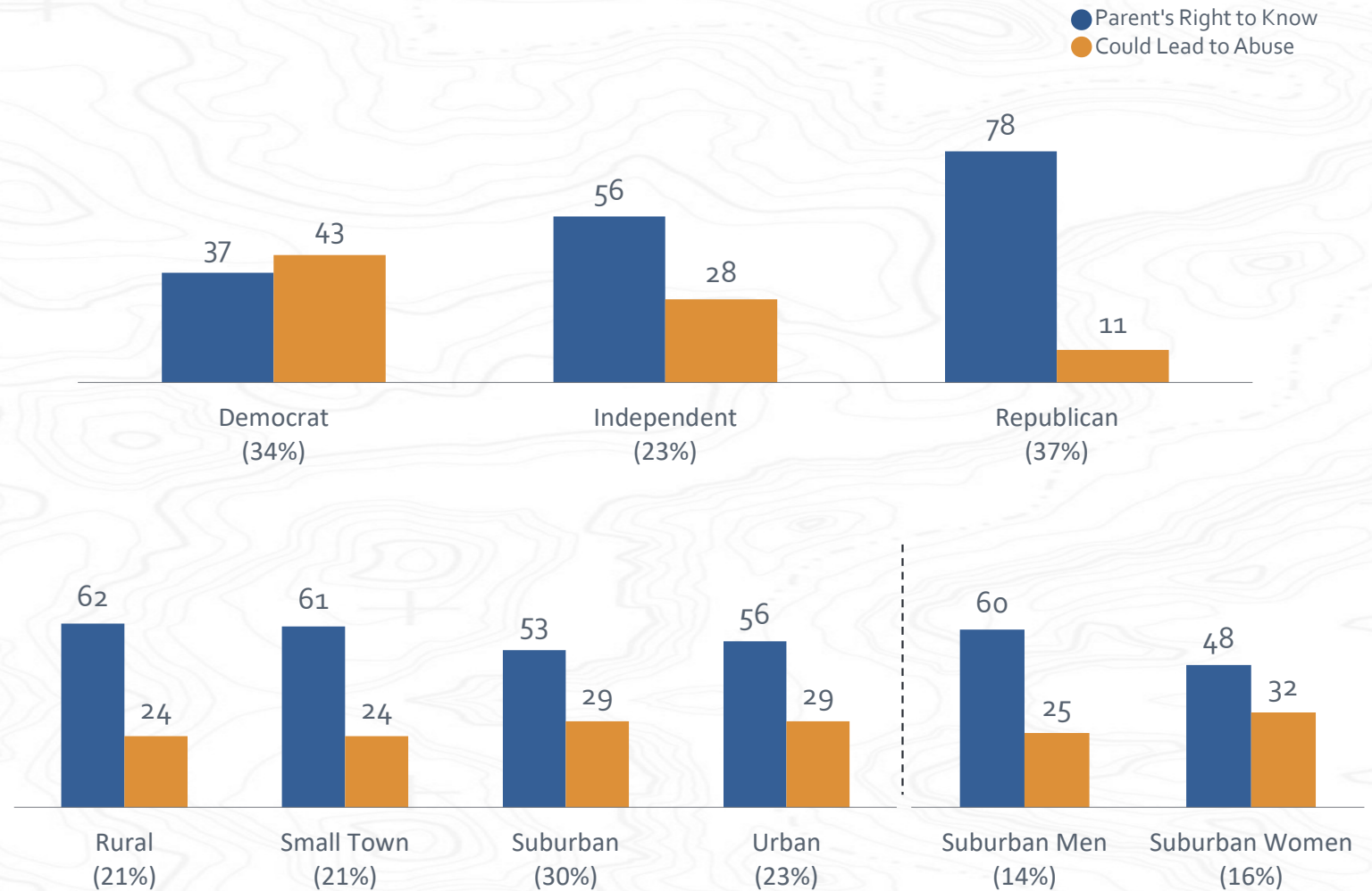
Parents have a fundamental right to know if their children publicly identify as transgender, and schools should disclose that information if they are aware of it.

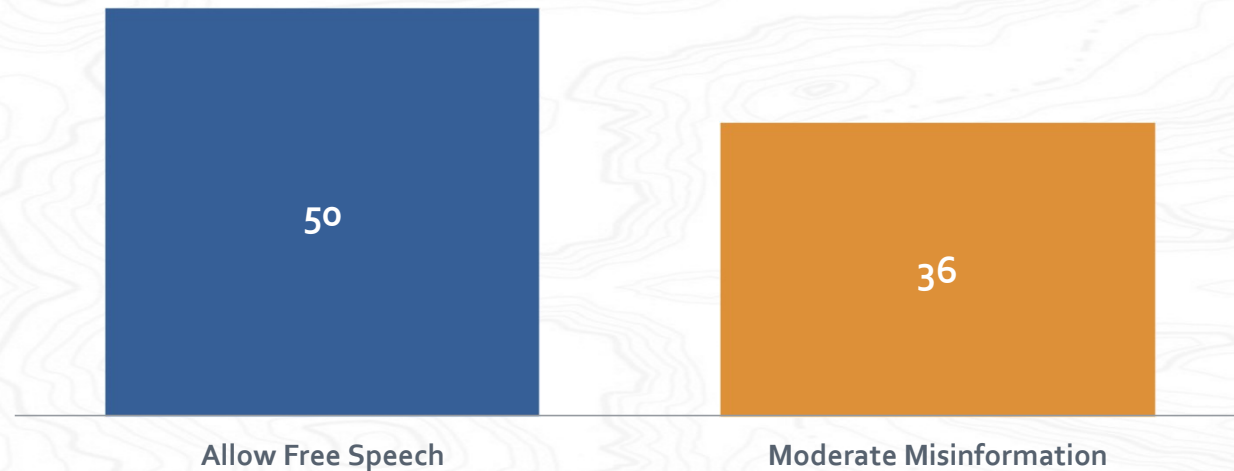


As you may have heard, there has recently been a debate regarding censorship on social media like Twitter and Facebook. Please tell me which of the following comes closest to your opinion.

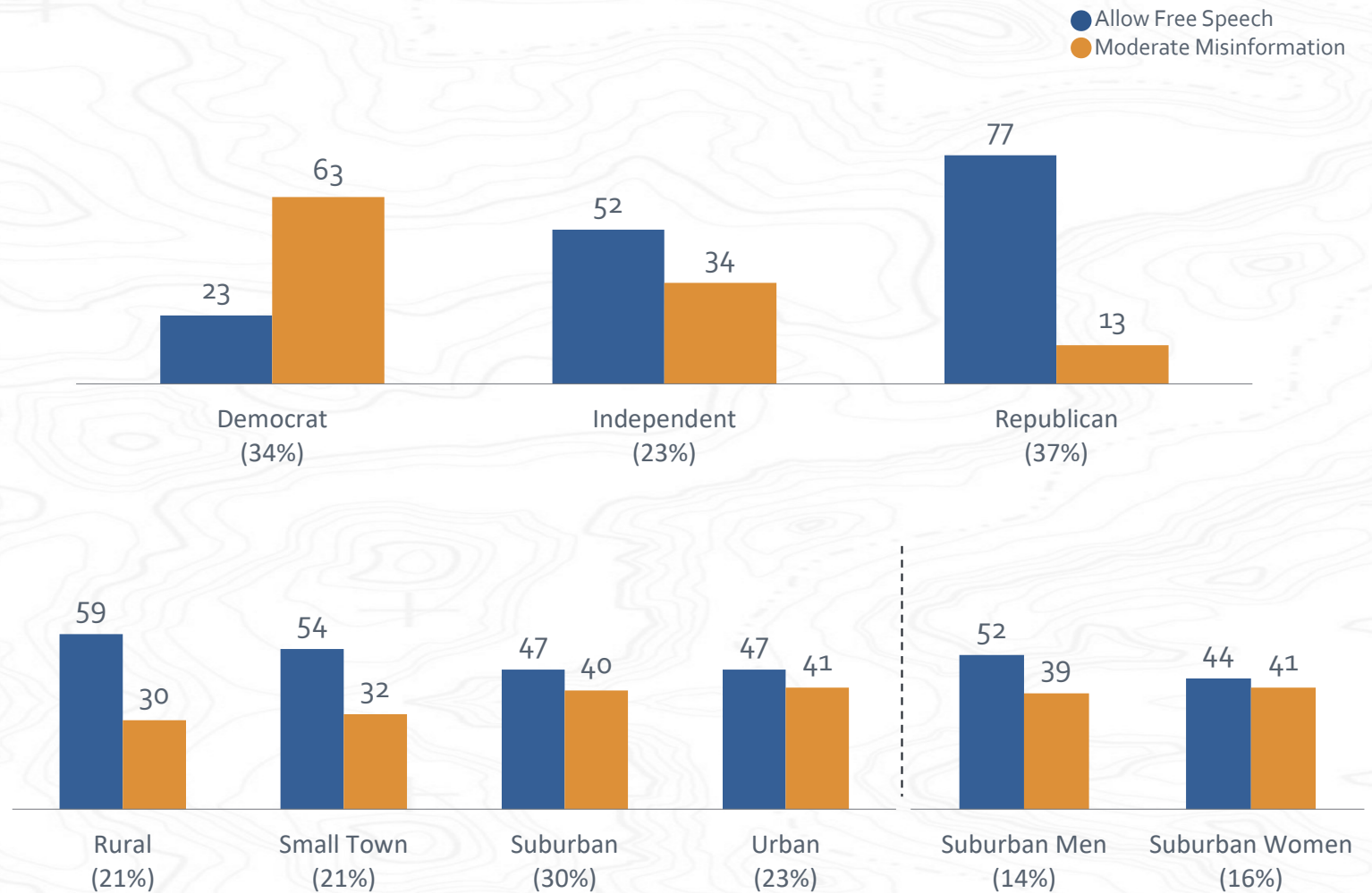
Other people say that misinformation is a real issue for our democracy and that Big Tech companies should do more content moderation to prevent misinformation from spreading.

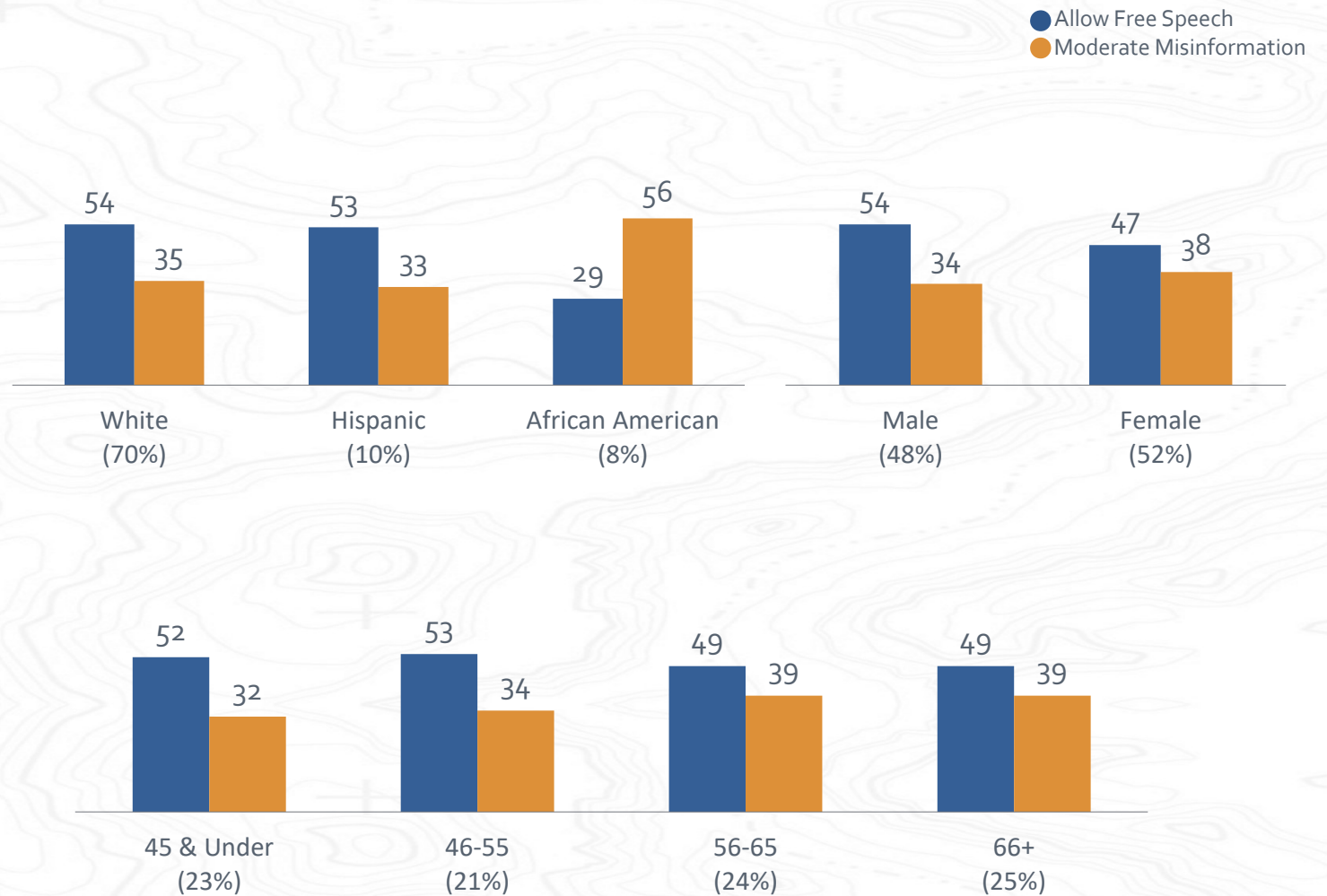

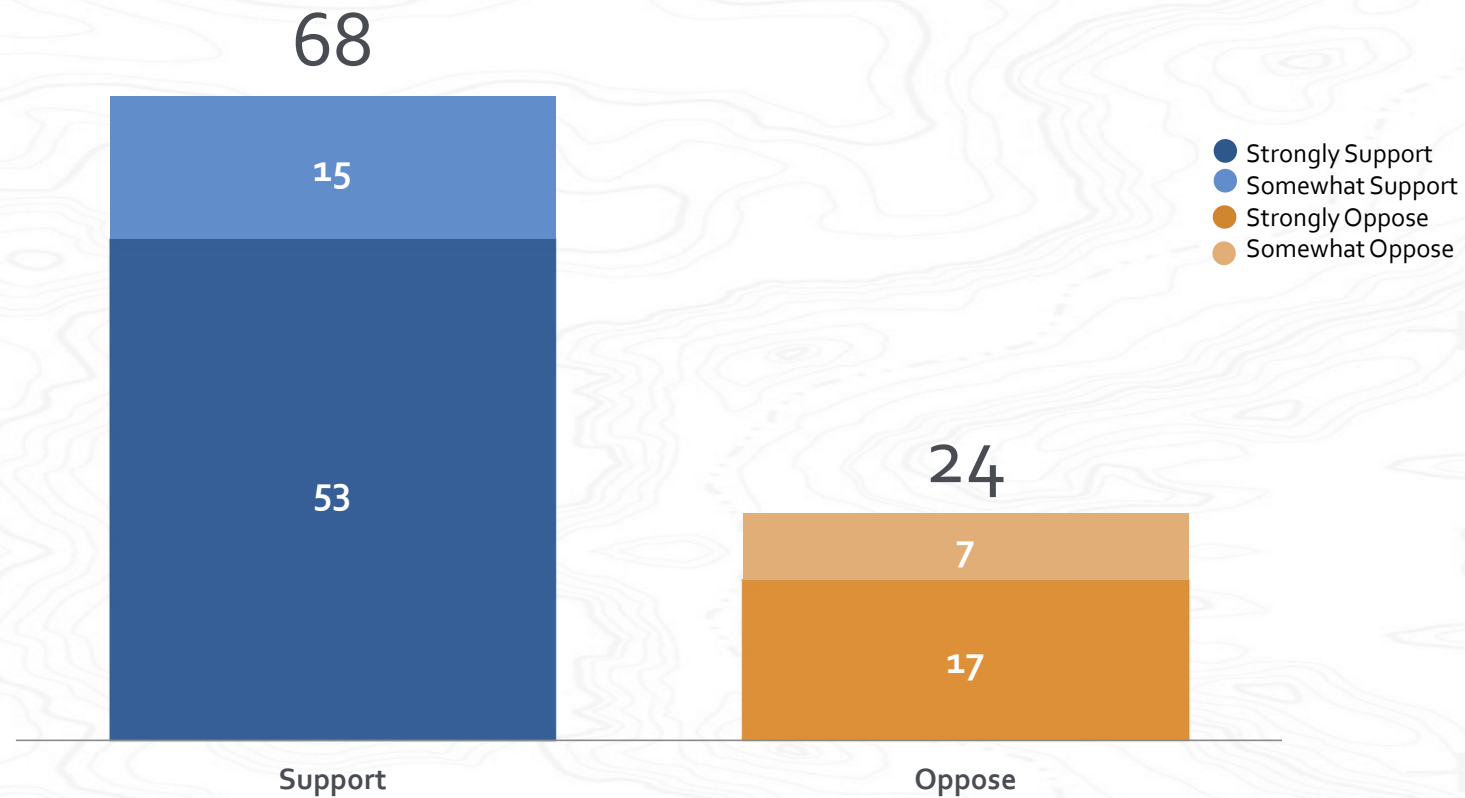

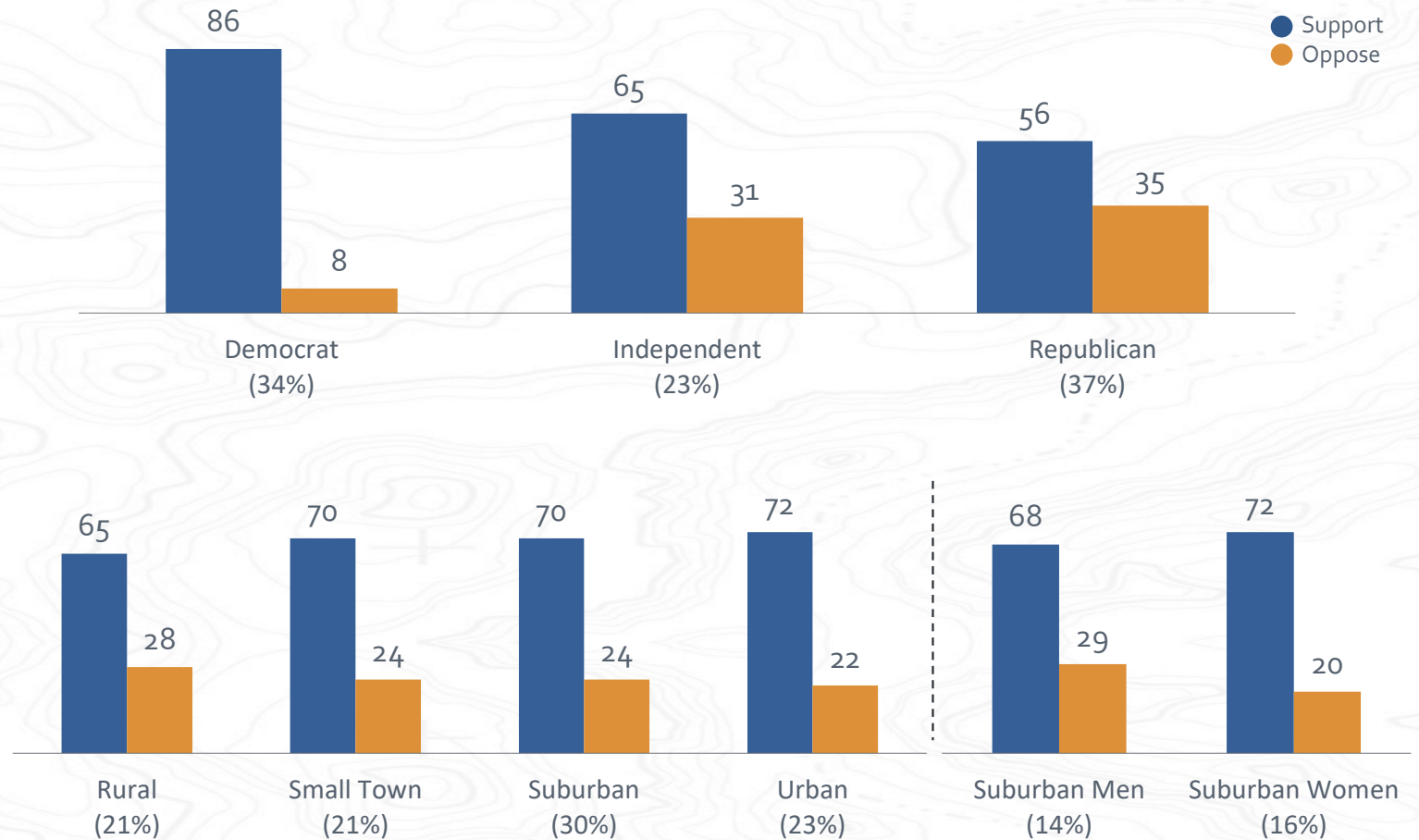
## PAID FAMILY LEAVE PROGRAM

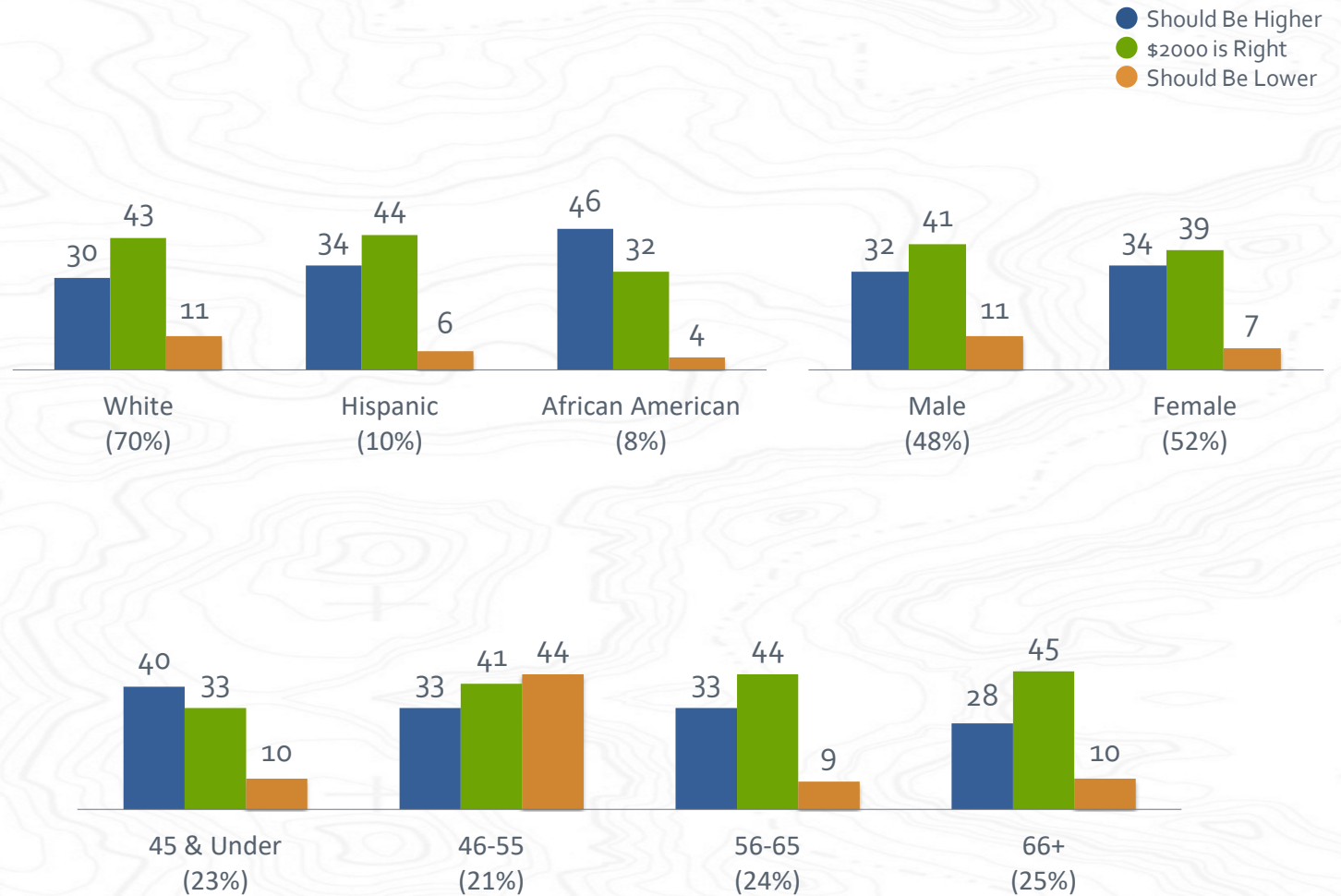
Some have proposed increasing the child tax credit, which is currently \$2,000 per child. How do you feel about the child tax credit?

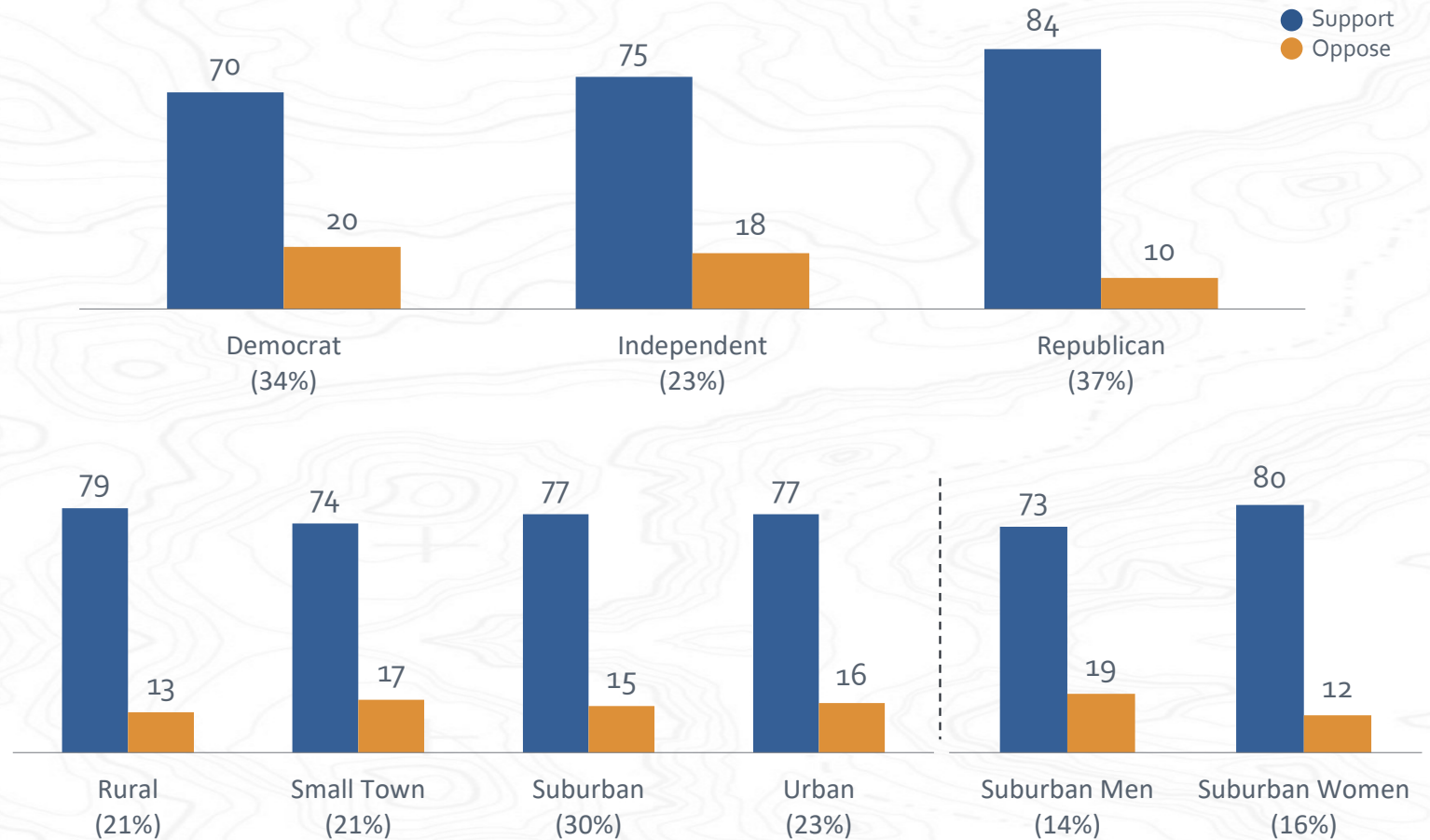
## PORNOGRAPHY AGE VERIFICATION

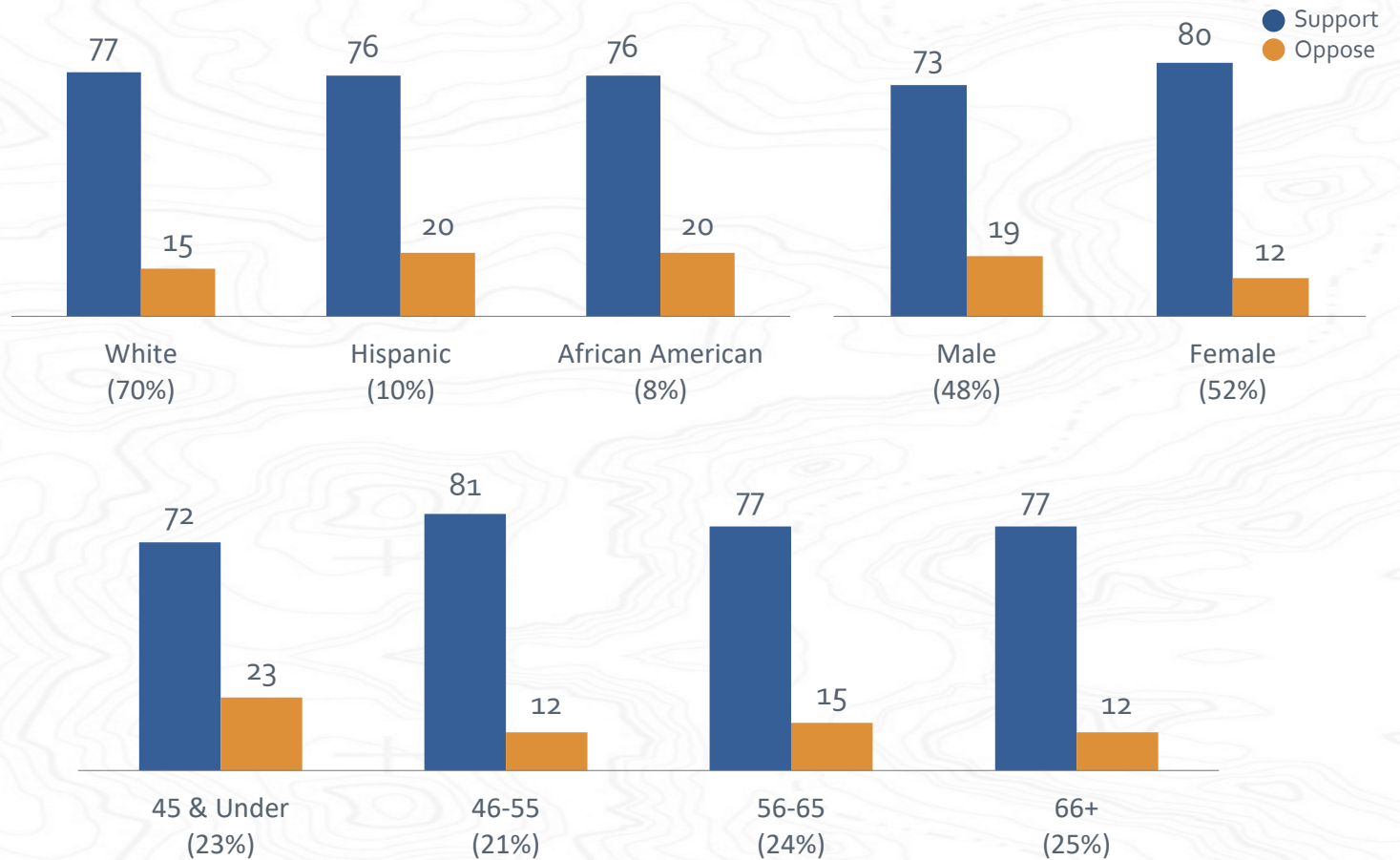

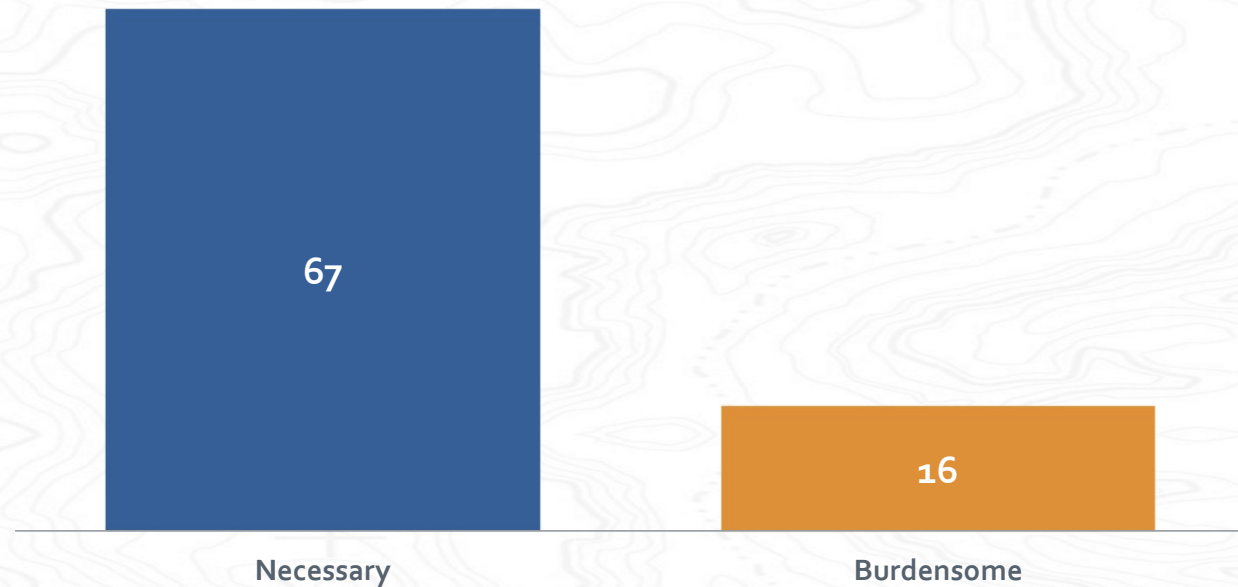

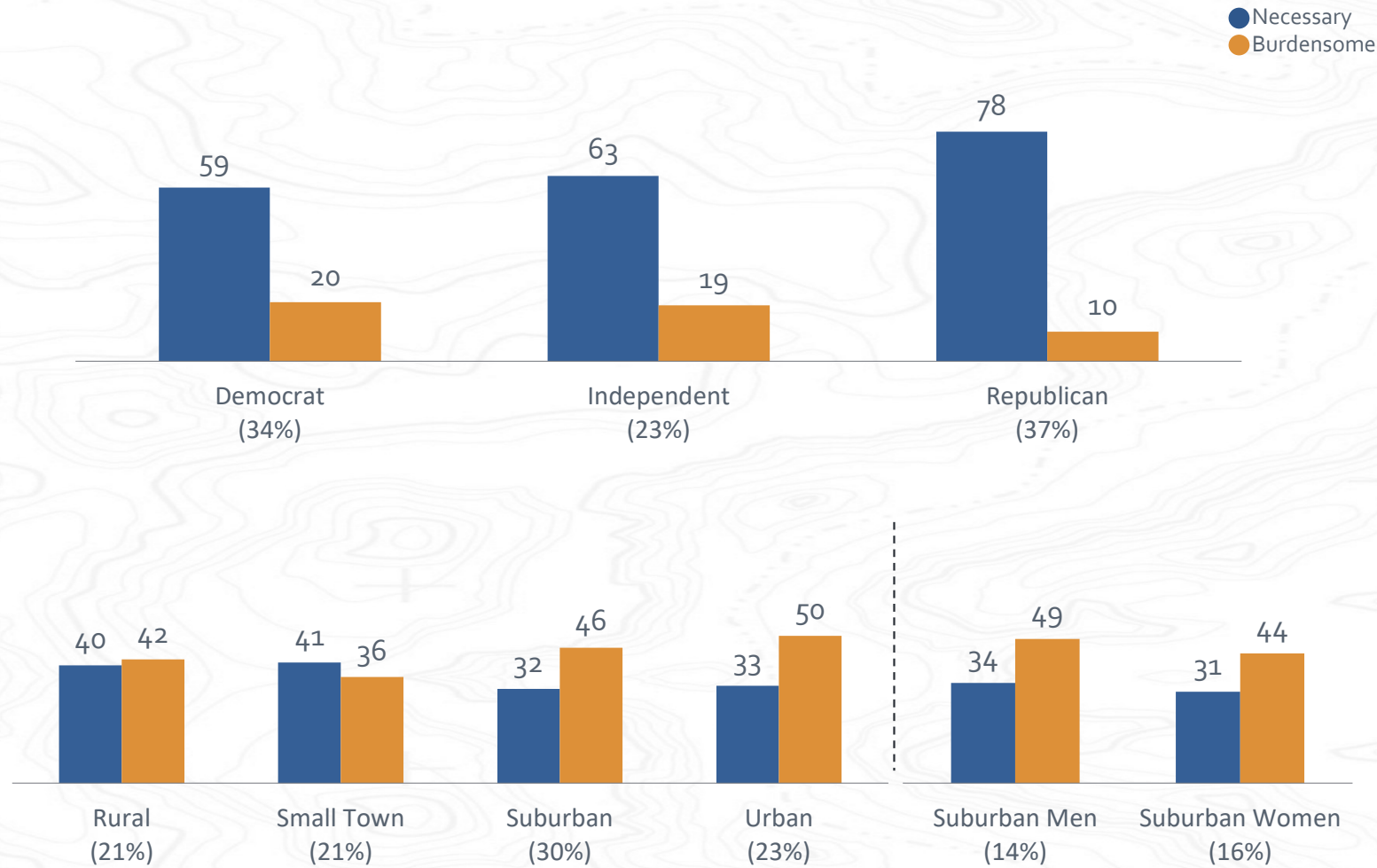

Other people say that this law would place an unnecessary burden on adults and would infringe on their privacy by requiring them to identify themselves to the website before they can access pornography.

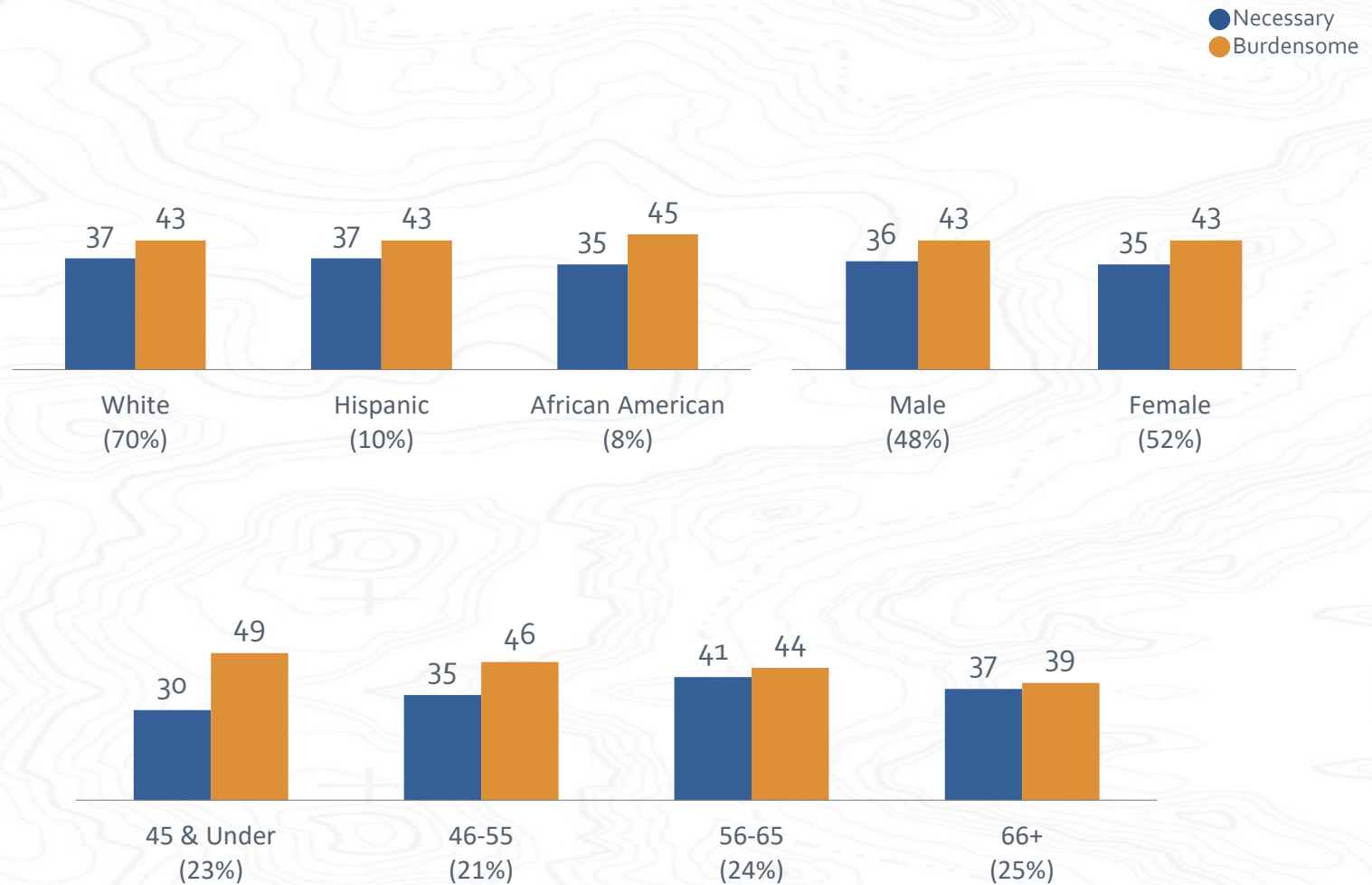
