

The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.0 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.



Q2: Voter Propensity


Thinking ahead to the November 5th General Election for President of the United States, how likely are you to vote? Would you say extremely likely, somewhat likely, or not very likely?








Q6 : Presidential Ballot






If a candidate running for public office lied or embellished their military record and used it to enhance their resume, would that make you more or less likely to vote for them?

Q10: Biden Health Coverup
































